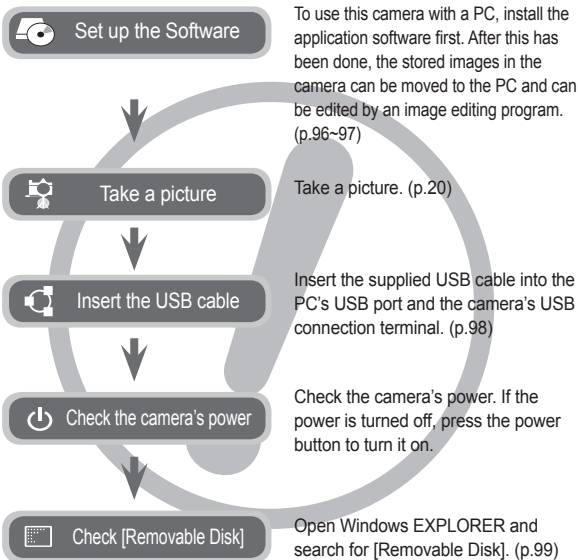

# Getting to know your camera

Thank you for buying a Samsung Digital Camera.

- Prior to using this camera, please read the user manual thoroughly.
- If you require After Sales service, please bring the camera and the cause of the camera malfunction (such as battery, Memory card etc.) to the A/S centre.
- Please check that the camera is operating properly prior to when you intend to use it (e.g. for a trip or an important event) to avoid disappointment. Samsung takes no responsibility for any loss or damage that may result from camera malfunction.
- Keep the manual in a safe place.
- The contents and illustrations in this manual are subject to change without prior notice for upgrading the camera functions.
- If you use a card reader to copy the images on the memory card to your PC, the images could be damaged. When transferring the images taken with the camera to your PC, be sure to use the supplied USB cable to connect the camera to your PC. Please note that the manufacturer accepts no responsibility for loss or damage of images on the memory card due to the use of a card reader.

## DANGER

- Should any form of liquid or a foreign object enter the camera, do not use it. Switch off the camera, and then disconnect the power source. You must contact your dealer or Samsung Camera Service centre. Do not continue to use the camera as this may cause a fire or electric shock.
- Do not insert or drop metallic or inflammable foreign objects into the camera through access points e.g. the memory card slot and battery chamber. This may cause a fire or electric shock.
- Do not operate this camera with wet hands. This could pose a risk of electric shock.

## WARNING

- Do not use the flash in close proximity to people or animals. Positioning the flash too close to your subject's eyes may cause eyesight damage.
- For safety reasons keep this product and accessories out of reach of children or animals to prevent accidents e.g.:
  - Swallowing battery or small camera accessories. If an accident should occur, please consult a doctor immediately.
  - There is the possibility of injury from the camera's moving parts.
- Battery and camera may become hot during prolonged use and it may result in camera malfunction. Should this be the case, allow the camera to sit idle for a few minutes to allow it time to cool.
- Do not leave this camera in places subject to extremely high temperatures, such as a sealed vehicle, direct sunlight or other places of extremes in temperature. Exposure to extreme temperatures may adversely affect the camera's internal components and could cause a fire.
- When in use, do not cover the camera or Charger. This may cause heat to build up and distort the camera body or cause a fire. Always use the camera and its accessories in a well-ventilated area.

# CAUTION

CAUTION indicates a potentially hazardous situation which, if not avoided, may result in a minor or moderate injury.

- Leaking, overheating, or burst battery could result in fire or injury.
  - Use battery with the correct specification for the camera.
  - Do not short circuit, heat or dispose of battery in fire.
  - Do not insert the battery with the polarities reversed.
- Remove the battery when not planning to use the camera for a long period of time. Battery may leak corrosive electrolyte and permanently damage the camera's components.
- Do not fire the flash while it is in contact with hands or objects. Do not touch the flash after using it continuously. It may cause burns.
- Do not move the camera while it is switched on when you are using the AC Charger. After use, always switch off the camera before unplugging the cable from the wall socket. Then make sure that any connector cords or cables to other devices are disconnected before moving the camera. Failure to do so may damage the cords or cables and cause a fire or electric shock.
- Take care not to touch the lens or lens cover to avoid taking an unclear image and possibly causing camera malfunction.
- Avoid obstructing the lens or the flash when you capture an image.
- When using this camera in low temperatures, you may experience the following. These are not camera malfunctions and usually recover at normal temperature.
  - It takes longer to turn on the LCD monitor and the colour may differ from the subject.
  - When changing the composition, there may be an after image on the LCD monitor.
- Credit cards may be demagnetized if left near case. Avoid leaving magnetic strip cards near the case.
- It is highly likely to result in computer malfunctions when the 20 pin connector is connected to the USB port of a PC. Never connect the 20 pin connector to USB port of a PC.

## ■ Self-timer lamp

Icon	Status	Description
	Blinking	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>For the first 7 seconds, the lamp blinks at 1 second intervals.</li> <li>For the final 3 seconds, the lamp blinks quickly at 0.25-second intervals.</li> </ul>
	Blinking	For the final 2 seconds, the lamp blinks quickly at 0.25-second intervals.
	Blinking	A picture will be taken after about 10 seconds and 2 seconds later a second picture will be taken.
	Blinking	After pressing the <b>Shutter</b> button, the image is taken in accordance with the subject's movement.
	Blinking	Pressing the remote control <b>Shutter</b> button will allow an interval of 2 seconds before the image is taken.

## ■ Camera Status Lamp

Status	Description
<b>Power on</b>	The lamp turns on and off when the camera is ready to take a picture.
<b>After taking a picture</b>	The lamp blinks while saving the image data and turns off when the camera is ready to take another picture.
<b>When the USB cable is inserted to a PC</b>	The lamp lights up. (LCD monitor turns off after initializing the device)
<b>Transmitting Data with a PC</b>	The lamp blinks. (LCD monitor turns off)

<b>When the USB cable is inserted to a printer</b>	The lamp blinks and turns off when the printer is ready to print a picture.

## Connecting to a power source

You should use the rechargeable battery SLB-10A supplied with the camera. Be sure to charge the battery before using the camera.

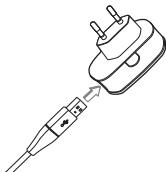
Important information about battery usage.

- When the camera is not used, turn off the camera power.
- Please remove the battery if the camera will not be used for long periods. Batteries can lose power over time and are prone to leaking if kept inside the camera.
- Low temperatures (below 0°C) can affect the performance of the battery and you may experience reduced battery life.
- Batteries will usually recover at normal temperatures.
- During extended use of the camera, the camera body may become warm. This is perfectly normal.

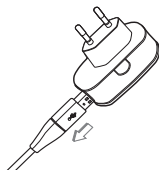
## Connecting to a power source

Connecting the AC adapter with the USB cable can be used as an AC cable, and you can charge the rechargeable battery with the AC cable.

- Using an AC cable:  
Connect the AC adapter to the USB cable.  
It can be used as a power cable.



- Using a USB cable:  
Remove the AC adapter.  
You can download stored images to your PC (p.98) or supply the power to your camera through the USB cable.

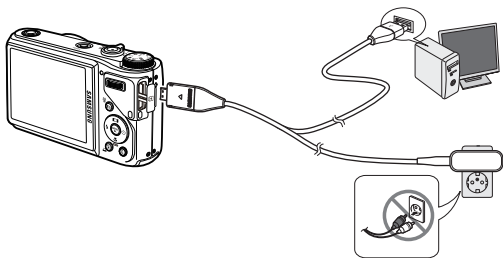


Important information about USB cable usage.

- Use a USB cable with the correct specification.
- If the camera is connected to the PC through a USB hub: connect the camera directly to the PC.
- If the camera and other devices are connected to the PC at the same time: remove other device.
- Camera can not be detected using the front side USB port of computer. In this case, use the back side USB port of computer.
- If the USB port of the PC doesn't meet the Power output standard (5V, 500mA), the camera may not be charged.

# Connecting to a power source

## ■ How to charge the rechargeable battery



- Before inserting any cables or AC adapter, check the directions and do not insert using force. It may cause breakage of cable or camera.
- If the charging LED of the AC Charger does not turn on or blink after inserting the rechargeable battery, please check whether the battery is inserted correctly.
- If you charge the battery with the camera power on, the battery can't charge fully. Turn the camera off while charging the battery.

## ■ Charging LED of the AC Adapter

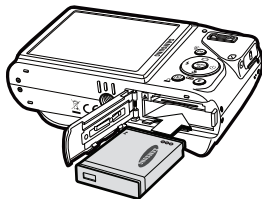
	Charging LED
Being Charged	Red LED is on
Charging is complete	Green LED is on
Charging error	Orange LED is off or blinking

- If you insert the fully discharged battery to charge it, do not turn on the camera at the same time. This is because of the low battery capacity. Charge the battery for more than 10 minutes before using the camera.
- Do not use the flash frequently or take a movie clip with the fully discharged battery charged for a short time. Even if the charger is inserted, the camera power may be turned off because the rechargeable battery is discharged again.





## Inserting the battery

Insert the battery as shown.

- If the camera does not turn on after you have inserted battery, please check whether the battery is inserted with the correct polarity (+/-).
- When the battery chamber cover is opened, do not force it. This may cause damage to the battery chamber cover.



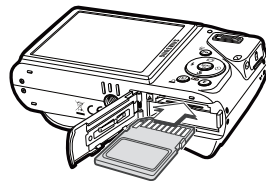
- There are 4 indicators for battery condition that are displayed on the LCD monitor.

## Inserting the memory card

Insert the memory card as shown.

- Turn off the camera's power before inserting the memory card.
- Have the front label of the memory card facing toward the front of the camera (Lens) and the card pins toward the back of the camera (LCD monitor).
- Do not insert the memory card the wrong way round. Doing so may damage the memory card slot.





# Instructions on how to use the memory card

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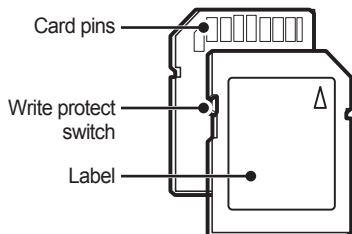
- Be sure to format the memory card (see p.84) if you are using a newly purchased memory card for the first time, if it contains data that the camera cannot recognise, or if it contains images captured with a different camera.
- Turn off the camera power whenever the memory card is being inserted or removed.
- Repeated use of the memory card will eventually reduce the memory card's performance. Should this be the case, you will need to purchase a new memory card. Wear and tear on the memory card is not covered by the Samsung warranty.
- The memory card is an electronic precision device. Do not bend, drop or subject the memory card to any heavy impact.
- Do not store the memory card in an environment with strong electronic or magnetic fields, e.g. near loud speakers or TV receivers.
- Please do not use or store in an environment where there are extremes in temperature.
- Do not allow the memory card to become dirty or to come into contact with any liquid. Should this happen, clean the memory card with a soft cloth.
- Please keep the memory card in its case when not in use.
- During and after periods of extended use, you may notice that the memory card is warm. This is perfectly normal.
- Do not use a memory card that is used in another digital camera. To use the memory card in this camera, format the memory card using this camera.
- Do not use a memory card formatted by another digital camera or memory card reader.
- If the memory card is subjected to any of the following, the recorded data may become corrupted:
  - When the memory card is used incorrectly.
  - If the power is switched off or the memory card is removed while recording, deleting (formatting) or reading.
- Samsung cannot be held responsible for lost data.
- It is advisable to copy important data onto other media as back-up e.g. floppy disks, hard disks, CD etc.
- If there is insufficient memory available:  
A [Memory Full!] message will appear and the camera will not operate. To optimise the amount of memory in the camera, replace the memory card or delete unnecessary images stored on the memory card.



- Don't remove the memory card when the camera status lamp is blinking as this may cause damage to data in the memory card.

# Instructions on how to use the memory card

The camera can use SD/ SDHC Memory Cards and MMC (Multi Media Cards).



<SD (Secure Digital) memory card>

The SD/ SDHC memory card has a write protect switch that prevents image files from being deleted or formatted. By sliding the switch to the bottom of the SD memory card, the data will be protected. By sliding the switch to the top of the SD memory card, the data protection will be cancelled. Slide the switch to the top of the SD memory card before taking a picture.

When using a 1GB SD memory, the specified shooting capacity will be as follows. These figures are approximate as image capacities can be affected by variables such as subject matter and memory card type.

- \* The recording times can be changed by the zoom operation. The **Zoom W/T lever** doesn't function during the movie recording.

# When using the camera for the first time

- Charge the rechargeable battery fully before using the camera for the first time.
- When the camera is turned on for the first time, a menu will be displayed in the LCD monitor to set date, time and language. This menu will not be displayed again after setting up the date, time and language. Set up the date, time and language before using this camera.

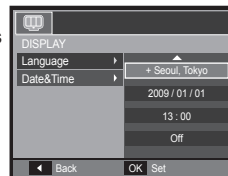
## ■ Setting up the language

1. Select the [Language] menu by pressing the **Up/Down** button and press the **Right** button.
2. Select the desired language by pressing the **Up/Down** button and press the **OK** button.



## ■ Setting up the date, time and date type

1. Select the [Date&Time] menu by pressing the **Up/Down** button and press the **Right** button.
2. Select the desired sub menu by pressing the **Up/Down/Left/Right** button and press the **OK** button.

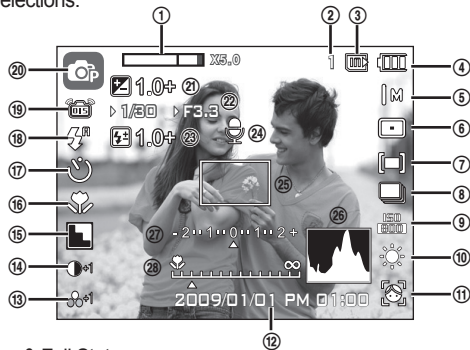


- Right** button: Selects world time/year/ month/ day/hour/minute/ date type.
- Left** button: Moves the cursor to the [Date&Time] main menu if the cursor is at the first item of the date and time setup. In all other instances, the cursor will be shifted to the left of its current position.
- Up/Down** button: Changes the value of each item.

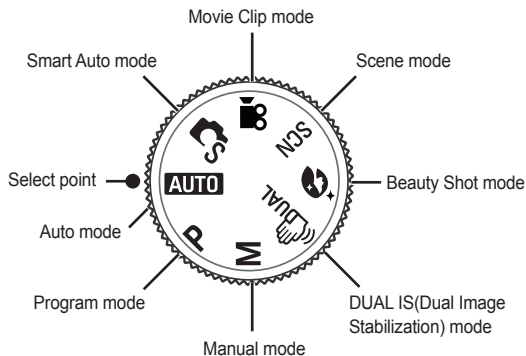
# Starting the Recording mode

## Selecting modes

You can select the shooting modes by using the mode dial on the upper of your camera.

### ■ How to use the mode dial

Select the shooting mode by turning the mode dial to the selection point.



## How to use the Auto mode

Select this mode for quick and easy picture taking with minimal user interaction.

1. Insert the battery (p.15) taking note of the correct polarity (+/-).
2. Insert the memory card (p.15). As this camera has a 21MB internal memory, it is not essential to insert the memory card. If the memory card is not inserted, an image will be stored in the internal memory. If the memory card is inserted, an image will be stored on the memory card.
3. Close the battery chamber cover.
4. Press the **POWER** button to turn on the camera. (If the date/time that is displayed on the LCD monitor is incorrect, reset the date/time before taking a picture.)
5. Select the Auto mode by using the mode dial.
6. Point the camera towards the subject and compose the image.
7. Press the **Shutter** button to capture an image.



- If the auto focus frame turns to red when you press the **Shutter** button down half way, it means that the camera cannot focus on the subject. Should this be the case, the camera is less likely to capture an image clearly.
- Avoid obstructing the lens or the flash when you capture an image.

# Starting the Recording mode

## How to use the Program mode

Selecting the automatic mode will configure the camera with optimal settings and you can manually configure various functions.

1. Select the Program mode by using the **Mode dial**. (p.20)
2. Point the camera towards the subject and compose the image by using the LCD monitor.
3. Press the **Shutter** button to capture an image.

\* Refer to page 40-47 for more information about the Program mode menus.



## How to use the Manual mode

The user can manually set both the aperture value and the shutter speed.

1. Select the Manual mode by using the **Mode dial**. (p.20)
2. Point the camera towards the subject and compose the image by using the LCD monitor.
3. Press the **Shutter** button to capture an image.

\* Refer to page 45 for more information about the menus.



## How to use the DUAL IS(Dual Image Stabilization) mode

This mode will reduce the effect of camera shake and help you get a well exposed image in dim conditions.

1. Select the DUAL IS mode by using the **Mode dial**. (p.20)
2. Point the camera towards the subject and compose the image by using the LCD monitor.
3. Press the **Shutter** button to capture an image.



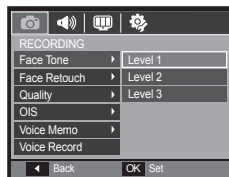
- Things to watch out for using the DUAL IS mode
  - The digital zoom will not operate in the DUAL IS mode.
  - If the lighting conditions are brighter than fluorescent lighting conditions, the DUAL IS will not activate.
  - If the lighting conditions are darker than in fluorescent lighting conditions, camera shake warning indicator (👉) will be displayed. For best results only take pictures in situations where the camera shake warning indicator (👉) is not displayed.
  - If the subject is moving, the captured image may be blurred.
  - As the DUAL IS uses the camera's digital signal processor, it may take a little longer for the camera to process and save the images.

# Starting the Recording mode

## How to use the Beauty Shot mode

Take a photo of portraits by setting options to clear facial imperfections.

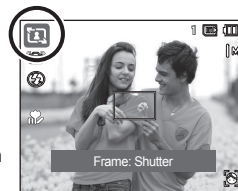
1. Select the Beauty Shot mode by using the **Mode dial**. (p.20)
2. Point the camera towards the subject and compose the image by using the LCD monitor.
3. Press the **MENU** button.
4. Press the **Up/Down** button to select [Face Tone] or [Face Retouch].
5. Press the **Right** button, then press the **Up/Down** button to select a desired level of each function.  
The higher the level is, [Face Tone] becomes brighter and [Face Retouch] features better performance.
6. Press the **OK** button to finish your setting.
7. Capture images in Recording mode by pressing the **Shutter** button.



## How to use the Scene modes
















Use the menu to easily configure optimal settings for a variety of shooting situations. (p. 56)

1. Select the Scene mode by using the **Mode dial**. (p.20)
2. Point the camera towards the subject and compose the image by using the LCD monitor.
3. Press the **Shutter** button to capture an image.

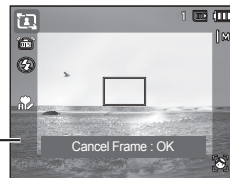

## ■ How to use the [Frame Guide] mode

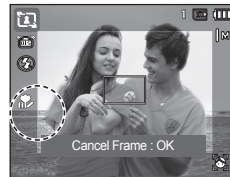
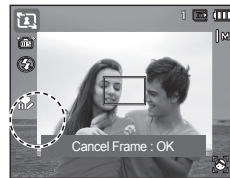
Set [Frame Guide] mode when you want someone else to take a picture for you from the angle you choose.

1. Take a picture from the angle you choose.
  - A translucent guide appears round the sides of the picture.

2. Then another person can take the picture by aligning the edge of the picture to be taken with the translucent guide framing the sides of the window.





# Starting the Recording mode

## How to use the Movie clip mode

A movie clip can be recorded for as long as the available recording time(maximum of 29 minutes) of the memory capacity allows.

1. Select the Movie clip mode by using the **Mode dial**. (p.20)
2. Point the camera towards the subject and compose the image by using the LCD monitor.
3. Press the **Shutter** button once and movie clips are recorded for up to 29 minutes. Movie clips will still be recorded if the **Shutter** button is released.



If you wish to stop recording, press the **Shutter** button again.

- \* Image size and type are listed below.
  - Image size: 1280X720HQ, 1280X720, 640x480, 320x240 (1280X720HQ and 1280X720 are the settings for recording high-quality videos.)
  - Movie clip file type: H.264(MPEG4.AVC)
  - Frame Rate: 60FPS, 30FPS, 15FPS
  - The frame rate can be selected when the following image size is selected.  
1280X720HQ, 1280X720, 640x480: 30FPS, 15FPS selectable.  
320x240: 60FPS, 30FPS 15FPS selectable.

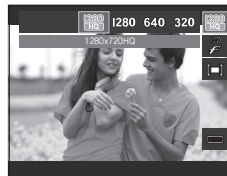


- If the recording time is takes longer 29 minutes, the recording is stopped and then saved.
- Select [Zoom Mute] from the recording menu during video recording to disable the recording of zoom sound.

## Recording HD (High Definition) movie clips

You can record HD (High Definition) movie clips. (1280X720, 30 fps) H.264(MPEG4.AVC) is a standard for the digital video codec. It supports a high quality movie clip in a small file size.

1. Select the Movie clip mode by using the **Mode dial**. (p.20)
2. Press the **Fn** button to set the resolution to either [1280HQ] or [1280].
3. Press the **Shutter** button to record video for the available recording time.



- What is **H.264(MPEG4 part10/AVC)** ?  
With its high-compression rate and the small file size, it is a standard for the digital video codec. It supports the recording functions in a high resolution.

# Starting the Recording mode

## Recording the movie clip without sound

You can record the movie clip without sound.

Steps from 1-3 are the same as those for Movie clip mode.

4. Press the **MENU** button.
5. Select the [RECORDING] menu by pressing the **Left/Right** button.
6. Press the **Down** button to select the [Voice] menu and press the **Right** button.
7. Select the [Off] menu by pressing the **Up/Down** button.
8. Press the **OK** button. You can record a movie without sound.



## Pausing while recording a movie clip (Successive Recording)

This camera allows you to temporarily stop during unwanted scenes, while recording a movie clip. Using this function, you can record your favourite scenes into a movie clip without having to create multiple movie clips.

### ■ Using Successive Recording

Steps from 1-2 are the same as those for Movie clip mode.

3. Point the camera towards the subject and compose the image by using the LCD monitor. Press the **Shutter** button and movie clips are recorded for as long as the available recording time. Movie clips will still be recorded if the **Shutter** button is released.
4. Press the **Play & Pause** (⏮/⏪) button to pause recording.
5. Press the **Play & Pause** (⏮/⏪) button again to resume the recording.
6. If you wish to stop recording, press the **Shutter** button again.



# Starting the Recording mode

## How to use the Smart Auto mode












The camera automatically chooses the appropriate camera settings based on a detected type of scene. It will be helpful if you are not familiar with the camera settings for various scenes.

1. Select Smart Auto mode by using the **Mode dial**. (p.20)
2. Point the camera towards the subject and compose the image by using the LCD monitor.
3. Press the Shutter button to capture an image.



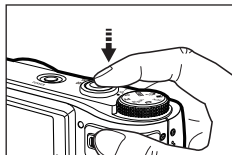
- If the camera does not recognize a proper scene mode, the default settings will be used.
- Even if there is a face detected, the camera may not select a portrait mode depending on the subject's position or lighting.
- The camera may not select the correct scene depending on shooting environments, such as camera shake, lighting, and distance to the subject.
- The [Night] mode recognizes scenes only when the flash is set to off. The camera operates the [Tripod] mode after checking the shooting condition on the tripod for a certain time.
- Despite using a tripod, the camera may not select a tripod mode depending on the subject's movement.

- Each scene is recognized in the following conditions;

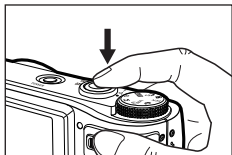
[Landscape]	(  )	: When shooting outdoor scenes
[White]	(  )	: When shooting in a very bright environment
[Night]	(  )	: When shooting the nighttime scenes
[Night Portrait]	(  )	: When shooting people in a dark outdoor place
[Backlight]	(  )	: When shooting a backlit scenery without a portrait
[Backlight Portrait]	(  )	: When shooting a backlit portrait
[Portrait]	(  )	: When shooting a portrait
[Macro]	(  )	: When shooting close-ups
[Macro Text]	(  )	: When shooting texts in a close focus
[Tripod]	(  )	: When shooting a subject without any movement on the tripod
[Action]	(  )	: When shooting a subject making frequent movements

# Things to watch out for when taking pictures

- Pressing the **Shutter** button down half way.  
Lightly press the **Shutter** button to confirm focus and flash battery charge.  
Press the **Shutter** button all way down to take the picture.

- The available memory capacity may vary depending on shooting conditions and camera settings.
- When the Flash Off or Slow synchro mode is selected in a low lighting condition, the camera shake warning indicator (👉) may appear on the LCD monitor. In this case, use a tripod, support the camera on a solid surface or change to flash shot mode.
- It is best to take pictures with the sun in the background. Taking pictures against the sun may make the picture come out dark. To take a picture against the light, please use the [Backlight] in scene shooting mode (see page 23), fill-in flash (see page 36), spot metering (see page 42), exposure compensation (see page 31) or ACB (see page 53) function.

- Avoid obstructing the lens or the flash when you capture an image.
- Compose the image by using the LCD monitor.
- Under certain conditions the auto focus system may not perform as expected.
  - When photographing a subject that has little contrast.
  - If the subject is highly reflective or shiny.
  - If the subject is moving at high speed.
  - When there is strong reflected light, or when the background is very bright.
  - When the subject matter has only horizontal lines or the subject is very narrow (such as a stick or flagpole).
  - When the surroundings are dark.

## Focus lock

---

To focus on a subject not positioned in the centre of the picture, use the focus lock function.

### ■ Using the Focus Lock

1. Ensure the subject is in the centre of the autofocus frame.
2. Press the **Shutter** button halfway. When the green auto focus frame lights up, it means the camera is focused on the subject. Be careful not to press the **Shutter** button all the way down to avoid taking an unwanted picture.
3. With the **Shutter** button still pressed down only halfway, move the camera to recompose your picture as desired, and then press the **Shutter** button completely to take the picture. If you release your finger from the **Shutter** button, the focus lock function will be cancelled.



1. The image to be captured.
2. Press the **Shutter** button halfway and focus on the subject.
3. Recompose the picture and fully depress the **Shutter** button.

## Using the camera buttons to set the camera

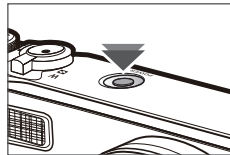

## POWER button

---

Used for turning the camera's power on/off. If there is no operation during the specified time, the camera's power will be turned off automatically to save battery life.

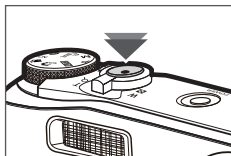

## Shutter button

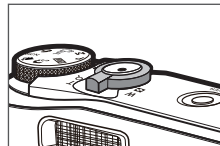
Used for taking an image or recording voice in the Recording mode.

- In Movie clip mode  
Pressing the **Shutter** button down fully starts the process for recording a movie clip. Press the **Shutter** button once and the movie clip is recorded for as long as the available recording time in the memory allows. If you wish to stop recording, press the **Shutter** button again.
- In Still image mode  
Pressing the **Shutter** button down halfway activates the autofocus and checks the condition of the flash.  
Pressing the **Shutter** button down fully takes and stores the image. If you select voice memo recording, the recording will start after the camera has finished storing the image data.



## Zoom W/T Lever

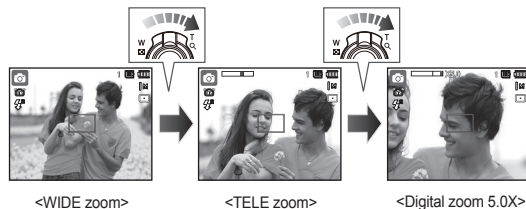
When the menu window is not displayed, this lever is used to control the optical or digital zoom. This camera has a 10X optical zoom and a 5X digital zoom function. Using both will offer a total zoom ratio of 50X.



### ■ TELE Zoom

Optical zoom TELE: Move the **Zoom W/T** lever to the right to see the subject closer.

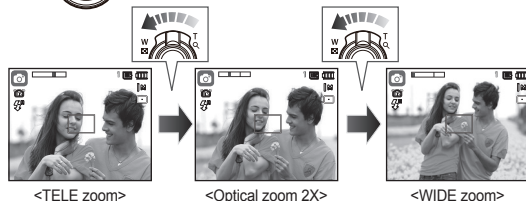
Digital zoom TELE: Move the **Zoom W/T** lever to the right once again in optical 10x zoom mode to enable digital zoom (software tele). Stop moving the **Zoom W/T** lever to stop the operation of digital zoom (tele). In digital 5x zoom mode, digital zoom is disabled even if you operate the **Zoom W/T** lever.



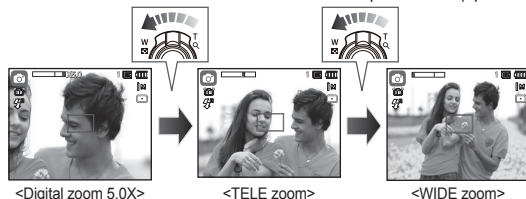
# Zoom W/T Lever

## ■ WIDE Zoom

Optical zoom WIDE: Move the **Zoom W/T** lever to the left in optical zoom mode to see subjects in the distance. Continue to move the **Zoom W/T** lever to the left to disable optical zoom.



Digital zoom WIDE: Move the **Zoom W/T** lever to the left in digital zoom mode to enable digital zoom (software wide). Stop moving the **Zoom W/T** lever to stop the operation of digital zoom. Continue to move the **Zoom W/T** lever to the left when digital zoom is disabled to disable optical zoom (optical tele).



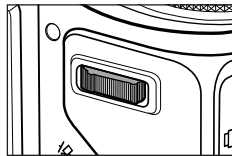
- Images taken using the digital zoom may take a little longer for the camera to process. Allow time for this to take place.
- You may notice a decrease in image quality when using the digital zoom.
- To view a clearer digital zoom image, press the Shutter button halfway at the maximum optical zoom position and press the Zoom T button again.
- The digital zoom can't be activated in the [Face Detection], [DUAL IS], [Beauty Shot], [Movie], [Smart Auto], and some Scene modes.
- Take care not to press the lens as this may cause a camera malfunction.
- The digital zoom cannot be used in movie clip shots.
- Select [Zoom Mute] from the recording menu during video recording to disable the recording of zoom sound.

# Command Lever

## How to use the Command lever mode

### ■ Exposure compensation

This product automatically controls exposure, adjusting it according to the recording situation. However, use the **command lever** to change the exposure to a different value.



1. Select [EV] under [Command Lever] in the menu.

2. Press the **command lever** to the left or right from the menu to set the desired exposure value.

※ For detailed information on setting the **command lever**, refer to Page 52.

- If you set the exposure to [-], exposure will not be properly performed. If you set the exposure to [+], the LCD monitor may look too white, and it may not be possible to capture a good image. Take care when altering exposure.



● In [Manual] mode, you cannot control exposure by using the **command lever**.

### ■ Controlling ISO/White Balance

You can enable the desired features for the **command lever**.

1. Select [ISO] or [WB] under [Command Lever] in the menu. (p.52)

2. Press the **command lever** to the left or right to select the submenu for each feature from the recording mode window.

※ For detailed information on setting [ISO] and [WB], refer to Page 44.

● [Command Lever] can be set in [Program], [Manual], [DUAL IS], or [Movie] mode and [ISO] can be set in [Program] or [Manual] mode.

● If you want to set [EV] after setting [ISO] or [WB], press the **Fn** button to switch to the exposure control window. Once [EV] are set, the exposure control icon will appear on the window.

### ■ Controlling the Aperture Value and Shutter Speed in [Manual] Mode

Press the **command lever** to the left or right from the [Manual] mode to control the aperture value and shutter speed.

### ■ Moving to Another Menu

Press the **command lever** to the left or right from the menu window to move to another main menu.

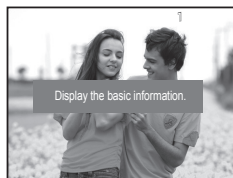

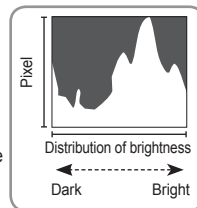

### Histogram

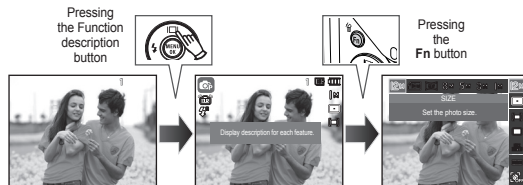
Histogram shows you the distribution of brightness in recorded images. If the bars in the histogram are higher towards the right, the image may be too bright. If the bars are higher on the left, the image may be too dark. If the lighting conditions are too bright to check the subject by using the LCD, checking the histogram will enable more precise exposure control for the shots.



### Grid

If you focus on the subject using a variety of horizontal or vertical grids, you will be able to take pictures at better angles, checking size, horizontality, or proportions. For information on types of grid and how to set them, refer to Page 82.

- Function description: When pressing the Function description button on the information screen mode, detailed descriptions of the functions can be viewed. The function description can be cancelled by pressing the Function description button again.

# Macro (🌱) / Down button

While the menu is showing, press the **Down** button to move from the main menu to a sub menu, or to move down the sub menu. When the menu is not showing, you can use the **Macro(🌱)/Down** button to take macro pictures. The distance ranges are shown below. Press the **Macro** button until the desired macro mode indicator appears on the LCD monitor.

## ■ How to Set Focus Manually

If it is difficult to get the automatic focus to work (for example in low light), you can manually control the focus.

1. Press the **Macro** button to enable manual focus.  
- Then the control bar for manual focus will appear.
  2. Press the **Left/Right** button to control the focus as you want.
- ✕ Set the manual focus to expand the center of the window to the entire window. Press the **Shutter** button halfway to return to the original state.

## Flash (⚡) / Left button

When the menu is displayed on the LCD monitor, pressing the **Left** button makes the cursor shift to the left tab.

When the menu is not displayed on the LCD monitor, the **Flash (⚡)/Left** button operates as the **Flash (⚡)** button.

### ■ Selecting the flash mode

1. Select a desired Recording mode, except the [Movie] mode and the [DUAL IS] mode. (p.20)
2. Press the **Flash** button until the desired flash mode indicator is displayed on the LCD monitor.
3. A flash mode indicator will be displayed on the LCD monitor. Use the correct flash to suit the environment.

- If you press the **Shutter** button after selecting the flash, the first flash fires to check the shooting condition (Flash range and Power ratio of flash). Do not move the camera until the second flash fires.
- Using the flash frequently will reduce the life of the battery.
- Under normal operating conditions the re-charging time for the flash is usually within 5 seconds. If the battery is weak, the charging time will be longer.
- The flash function will not operate in the [DUAL IS], [Movie], [Blink Detection], and some Scene mode.
- Take photographs within the flash range.
- The image quality is not guaranteed if the subject is too close or highly reflective.
- When taking an image in poorly lit conditions with the flash, there may be a white speck in the captured image. The speck is caused by the flash light reflecting off atmospheric dust.

## Self-timer (☺) / Right button

When the menu is displayed on the LCD monitor, pressing the **Self-timer (☺) / Right** button makes the cursor shift to the right tab. When the menu is not displayed on the LCD monitor, the **Self-timer (☺) / Right** button operates as the **Self-timer (☺)** button. This function is used when the photographer would also like to be in the image.



- If you operate the **Self-timer (☺)** button during the self-timer operation, the self-timer function is cancelled.
- Use a tripod to prevent the camera from shaking.
- In Movie Clip mode, only the 10SEC self-timer will work.
- When you select 2SEC self-timer with flash, the delay (2 seconds) can be extended according to the flash charging status.
- When taking a picture using the self-timer, the self-timer lamp works as follows :

Once setting is complete, the focus mark will be fixed at the position set. If you want to change the position of the focus mark, press the Fn button and select [Selection AF]. Then the focus mark setting window will appear.

- High resolution and picture quality increases file saving time, which increases stand-by time.
- If the [Continuous], [High Speed], [AEB] or [Motion Capture] sub menu is selected, the flash will be off automatically.
- If less than 30 pictures are available in the memory, the motion capture is not available.
- It is best to use a tripod for the [AEB] shooting as the time to save each image file is longer and blurring caused by camera shake may occur.
- In [Manual] mode, [High Speed], [AEB], and [Motion Capture] are disabled.
- [Continuous], [High Speed] and [AEB] menus can be selected only when the shutter speed is faster than 1/4 second. If the shutter speed is slower than 1/4 second, it will be fixed with 1/4 second.

## Fn button: ISO

You can select the ISO sensitivity when taking pictures.

The speed or specific light-sensitivity of a camera is rated by ISO numbers.

- × [ISO] is enabled only in [Program] or [Manual] mode.

## Fn button: White balance

The white balance control allows you to adjust the colours to appear more natural.



Icon	White balance Mode	Description

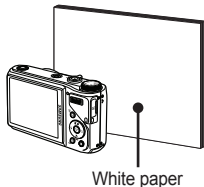

## Fn button: White balance

### ■ Using the Custom White Balance

White balance settings may vary slightly depending on the shooting environment. You can select the most appropriate white balance setting for a given shooting environment by setting up the custom white balance.

1. Select the [Measure: SH] (☐) menu of the White Balance and place a sheet of white paper in front of the camera so that the LCD monitor shows only white.



2. **MENU/OK** button: Selects previous custom white balance.

**Shutter** button: Saves new custom white balance.

- The custom white balance value will be applied, starting with the next picture you take.
- The user configured white balance will remain effective until it is overwritten.

## Fn button: Aperture Value

This mode will set the aperture value for automatic exposure in manual mode. Smaller aperture values make the object sharp but blur the background. Larger aperture values make both the object and background sharp.



Aperture Value

### ■ Setting up the Aperture Value

Press the **Fn** button. Then press the **command lever** to the left or right to set the aperture value.

## Fn button: Shutter Speed

This mode will set the shutter speed for automatic exposure in manual mode. High shutter speeds can capture a moving object in a way that makes it seem as if the object is not moving. Low shutter speeds can capture a moving object, giving it a dynamic feeling of movement.



Shutter Speed

### ■ Setting up the Shutter Speed

Press the **Fn** button and then **Left/Right** button. Press the **command lever** to the left or right to set the shutter speed.

# Fn button: Face Detection

If you use face detection options, your camera can detect a human face. When focusing on a human face, the brightness of the face is also adjusted. You can also capture natural facial expressions by using self portrait, smile shot or blink detection.



※ Selectable modes: [Auto], [Program], [Manual], [DUAL IS], [Beauty Shot], [Scene] ([Portrait], [Children], [Beach&Snow], [Self-Shot], [Café])

## ■ Face Detection

This mode detects the face position of the subject automatically and then sets the focus and exposure.

1. The size and position of the auto focus frame is automatically set on the face of the subject.

2. Press the **Shutter** button halfway.

- When the camera detects a target face, the white colour focus frame will be displayed over the target face and the grey colour focus frame appears over the remaining faces. Press the shutter button halfway down to focus on the face and the white focus frame turns green.



3. Press the **Shutter** button fully to take a picture.



- This function can detect up to 10 faces.
- When the camera recognises many people at the same time, it will focus on the nearest person.
- Return to previous AF mode if face detection failed.
- In some conditions this function cannot work properly.
  - When a person wears dark glasses or some part of the face is hidden.
  - When the subject does not look at the camera.
  - Camera doesn't detect a face as the conditions are too dark or too bright.
  - The distance between the camera and object is too great.
  - If there is reflection of the light or the back light that are too bright.
- The maximum available Face Detection range is 2.5m (Wide).
- The nearer the subject, the faster the camera can recognize the subject.
- When using the digital zoom, [Face Detection] is not available.
- In [Beauty Shot], [Frame Guide], [Portrait], and [Children] mode, the [Face Detection] function setting is set to its default value.

# Fn button: Face Detection

## ■ Self Portrait

When taking pictures of yourself, the area of your face is automatically detected so that you can take self portraits more easily and quickly.

1. For self-filming, set the camera lens towards the face of the object. It automatically detects the face of the object, and emits a guiding sound.
  - When locating the face in the center of the screen, it repeatedly emits a faster sound unlike the sounds that are emitted when the face is not in the center.



2. Start filming by pressing the **Shutter** button.



- The guiding sound can be set using the [Self-Portrait] Menu. (p.81)

## ■ Smile Shot

The camera automatically takes a picture by detecting the face of the subject although you don't press the shutter button. If you press the **Shutter** button, the picture is taken in the normal way. When taking a picture of smile shot, showing teeth or keeping the smiley face of your subject helps detecting the smile face of the subject.



## ■ Blink Detection

If the eyes of the subject are closed when the shutter button is pressed, the camera takes 3 continuous shots and then the images are saved.

The camera takes only one picture if the eyes of the subject are open when the **Shutter** button is pressed.



























- Detecting the smiling face or the blinking eyes may not be available if any of the following situations occurs:
  - If the subject is wearing sunglasses.
  - When the subject is not facing directly to the camera.
  - If the environmental light is too bright or too dark to detect the face of the subject.
  - When the camera is far from the subject. (Orange colored focusing mark)
  - If there is reflection of the light or the back light that are too bright.



## E (Effect) button

It is possible to add special effects to your images by using this button.

## E (Effect) button: Photo Style Selector

You can add various effects to the image without an image editing software.

2. Press the **Shutter** button to take an image.

## ACB

This function is to adjust the contrast automatically when taking photos in an environment with big exposure difference i.e. backlight or contrast. This function adjusts the brightness automatically and allows the subject to be photographed clearly.

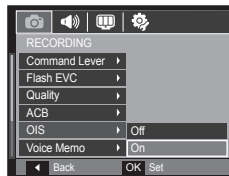

## OIS (Optical image Stabilization)

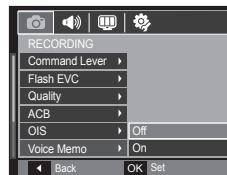

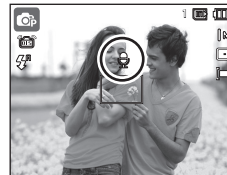
- OIS function may not work sufficiently in the following cases.
  - To take pictures of a moving subject.
  - To take pictures with higher digital zoom values.
  - When camera shake is beyond the camera-shake correction range.
  - When the shutter speed is slow.
  - When the battery is low.
- If you operate OIS function using a tripod, the image can be blurred by the vibration of the sensor of the OIS. Turn off the OIS function when you use a tripod.
- If the camera is subjected to an impact, the LCD monitor can be affected. To make the camera function properly again, turn it on and off.

## Voice Memo

You can add your voice-over to a stored still image. (Max. 10 sec.)



- If the voice memo indicator is displayed on the LCD monitor, the setting is completed.
- Press the **Shutter** button and take a picture. The picture is stored on the memory card.
- Voice memo will be recorded for ten seconds from the moment the picture is stored. In the middle of the sound recording, pressing the **Shutter** button will stop the voice memo.

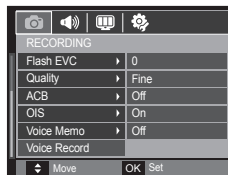


# Voice recording

A voice can be recorded for as long as the available recording time (Max. 10 hour) allows.

Press the **Shutter** button to record a voice.

# Using the camera buttons to set the camera

In Play mode, you can use the buttons on the camera to conveniently set up the Play mode functions.

## Play mode button

- If you have turned on the camera by pressing the **POWER** button, you can press the **Play mode** button once to switch to Play mode and press it again to switch to Recording mode.
- You can turn the power on with the **Play mode** button. The camera is turned on in play mode. Press the **Play mode** button again to turn off the camera.
- Manner mode: To select the Manner mode, press the **Play mode** button for more than 3 seconds. In the Manner mode, Operating sound, Effect sound, Start-up sound and Shutter sound will not be generated. To cancel the Manner mode, turn on the camera by pressing the **POWER** button.



## Thumbnail (🖼️) / Digital Zoom (🔍) Lever

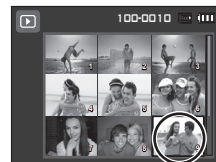
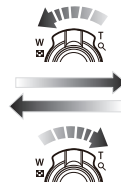
You can view multiple pictures, enlarge a selected picture, and crop and save a selected area of an image.

### ■ Thumbnail display

1. Once a picture has been played back, move the **Thumbnail** lever to the left.

- A large sized image can be resized to a smaller sized image, but not vice versa.
- Only JPEG images can be resized. Movie clip (H264), Voice recording (WAV) files can't be resized.
- You can change the resolution of only those files compressed in the JPEG 4:2:2 format.
- The resized image will have a new file name. The [Start Image] image is stored not on the memory card but on the internal memory.

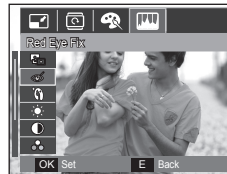

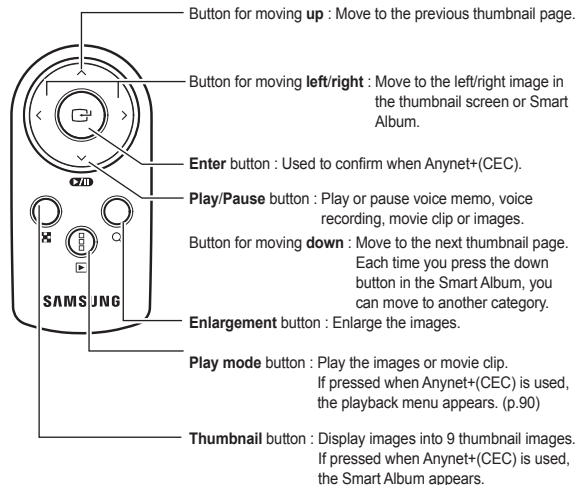

## Starting the slide show ( )

Images can be displayed continuously at pre-set intervals. You can view the slide show by connecting the camera to an external monitor.

- Of all the files stored in the memory card, the unprotected files in the DCIM subfolder will be deleted. Remember that this will permanently delete unprotected images. Important shots should be stored on a computer before deletion takes place. The startup image is stored in the camera's internal memory (i.e., not on the memory card) and it will not be deleted even if you delete all files on the memory card.

## DPOF

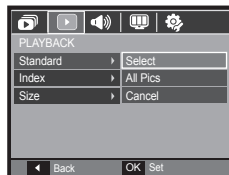
- DPOF(Digital Print Order Format) allows you to embed printing information on your memory card's MISC folder. Select the pictures to be printed and how many prints to make.
- The DPOF indicator will be displayed on the LCD monitor when an image that has DPOF information plays back. Images can then be printed on DPOF printers, or at an increasing number of photo labs.
- This function is not available for movie clips and voice recording files.
- When the wide angle image is printed as a wide angle print, 8% of the left and right side of the image may not be printed. Check that your printer can support the wide angle image when you print the image. When you print the image at a photo lab, request that the image is printed as a wide angle image. (Some photo labs may not support the wide angle size print.)

### Setting the Anynet+(CEC)

# Settings (⚙️)

## HDMI Size

When the camera is connected with the HDTV, you can select image size that is compatible with the HDTV. The image size are [1080i], [720p], [480p] and [576p]. Only when [480p] is set to [NTSC] and [576p] is set to [PAL], those resolutions can be set in the menu.

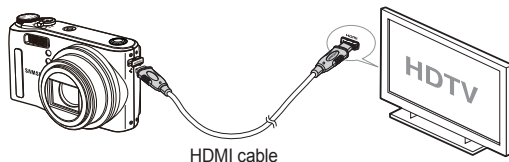


- HDMI (High Definition Multimedia Interface) is a function that allows transferring the recorded images without compression by using the HDMI cable. You can see the images in a high resolution in the HDTV.
- HDMI resolution is set to [480p](NTSC) or [576p](PAL), it is only available to play back the image, movie clip, voice.
- If the selected HDMI resolution is not supported by HDTV, the clear image can not be shown in the screen.
- If you try to select the HDMI resolution that is not supported by HDTV, the resolution is adjusted to the maximum resolution of the HDTV. For example, if you select "1080i" when the HDTV supports the "720p" by the maximum resolution, it is adjusted to "720p."
- When [HDMI size] is set to [720p], you can get better picture quality.
- You can playback the normal resolution of the movie clip as well.
- You can not connect HDMI to HDTV which is not supported. Please check up the specification of HDTV before connecting it.

## ■ How to connect the camera with the HDTV

Connect the HDMI cable to the HDMI port of both the camera and HDTV.

✕ Connect the AC cable to the camera first, before connecting the HDMI cable to the HDTV.



- As the above picture, do not use the AV cable at the same time if you connect HDMI to HDTV. When you connect HDMI to HDTV, please connect only HDMI cable and remove the AV cable.

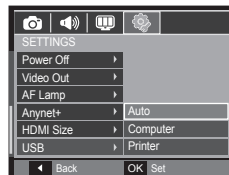

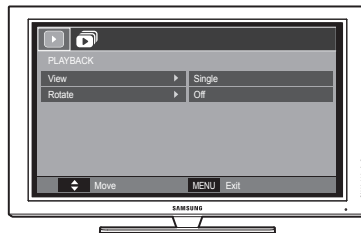

## ■ How to use the Anynet+(CEC)

1. Connect the HDMI cable to the HDMI port of both the camera and HDTV. (p.89)
2. TV turns on as soon as the power button is pressed on the camera.

## Important notes

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Be sure to observe the following precautions!

- **This unit contains precision electronic components. Do not use or store this unit in the following locations.**
  - Areas exposed to extremes of in temperature and humidity.
  - Areas exposed to dust and dirt.
  - Areas exposed to direct sunlight or the inside of a vehicle in hot weather.
  - Environments where there is high magnetism or excessive vibration.
  - Areas with high explosives or highly flammable materials.
- **Do not leave this camera in places subject to dust, chemicals (like naphthalene and mothballs), high temperature and high humidity. Keep this camera with silica gel in a hermetically sealed box when not planning to use the camera for a long period of time**
- **Sand can be particularly troublesome to cameras.**
  - Do not let sand get inside the camera when using it on beaches, coastal dunes, or other areas where there is lots of sand.
  - Doing so may result in failure or may permanently render the camera unusable.
- **Handling the camera**
  - Never drop the camera or subject it to severe shocks or vibrations.
  - Protect the large size LCD monitor from an impact. When this camera is not used, keep it in the camera case.
  - Avoid obstructing the lens or the flash when you capture an image.

# Important notes

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- This camera is not waterproof. To avoid dangerous electrical shocks, never hold or operate the camera with wet hands.
- If you use this camera in wet places, such as beach or pool, do not let water or sand get inside the camera. Doing so may result in failure or may permanently damage the unit.
- **Extremes in temperature may cause problems.**
  - If the camera is transferred from a cold to a warm and humid environment, condensation can form on the delicate electronic circuitry. If this occurs, turn the camera off and wait for at least 1 hour until all moisture is dispersed. Moisture built up can also occur on the memory card. If this happens, turn off the camera and remove the memory card. Wait until the moisture has dispersed before replacing the card in the camera.
- **Caution on Using the Lens**
  - If the lens is subjected to direct sunlight, it could result in the discoloration and deterioration of the image sensor.
  - Take care not to get fingerprints or foreign substances on the surface of the lens.
- **If the digital camera is not used for a long period, an electric discharge can occur. It is a good idea to remove the battery and the memory card if you do not intend using the camera for an extended period of time.**
- **If the camera is exposed to electronic interference, it will turn itself off to protect the memory card.**
- **Camera Maintenance**
  - Use a soft brush (available from photo stores) to gently clean the lens and LCD assemblies. If this does not work, lens-cleaning paper with lens cleaning fluid can be used. Clean the camera body with a soft cloth. Do not allow this camera to come into contact with solvent materials such as benzol, insecticide, thinners etc. This may damage the body shell of the camera and also affect its performance. Rough handling can damage the LCD monitor. Take care to avoid damage and keep the camera in its protective carry case at all times when not in use.
- **Do not attempt to disassemble or modify the camera.**
- **Under certain conditions, static electricity can cause the flash unit to fire. This is not harmful to the camera and is not a malfunction.**
- **When images are uploaded or downloaded, the data transfer may be affected by static electricity. In this case, disconnect and re-connect the USB cable before trying the transfer again.**
- **Before an important event or going on a trip, you should check the camera condition.**
  - Take a picture for testing the camera condition and prepare extra battery.
  - Samsung cannot be held responsible for camera malfunctions.
- **The temperature of the surface increases if the camera is used for prolonged periods of time. This doesn't affect the camera operation and is not a problem of the camera.**
- **If the digital camera is not used for a long period, the date and time may adopt the default settings by automatical battery discharged. In this case, reset the date and time correctly before the recording**

# Warning indicator

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There are several warnings that may appear on the LCD display.

## [ Card Error ! ]

- Memory card error.
  - Turn off the camera power and turn it on again.
  - Insert the memory card again.
  - Insert and format the memory card. (p.84)

## [ Card Locked! ]

- The memory card is locked.
  - SD/SDHC memory card: Slide the write protect switch to the top of the memory card.

## [ No Card! ]

- A memory card is not inserted.
  - Insert the memory card.
  - Turn off the camera power and turn it on again.

## [ No Image! ]

- There are no images stored on the memory.
  - Take images.
  - Insert a memory card that is holding some images.

## [ File Error! ]

- File error.
  - Delete the file.
- Memory card error.
  - Contact a camera service centre.

## [ Low Battery! ]

- There is low battery capacity.
  - Insert fresh batteries.

## [ Low Light! ]

- When taking pictures in dark places.
  - Take pictures in Flash Photography mode.

## [Out of Number]

- When selecting too many printing pages in the PictBridge menu.
  - Select printing page within the limitation.

## [DCF Full Error]

- Violation of DCF format.
  - Copy the images to a PC and format the memory.

# Before contacting a service centre

Please check the following.

## The camera doesn't switch on.

- There is low battery capacity.
  - Insert fresh batteries. (p.15)
- Battery is inserted incorrectly with the polarities reversed.
  - Insert the battery according to the polarity marks (+, -).

## The camera power ceases while in use.

- The battery is exhausted.
  - Insert a fully charged battery.
- The Camera is turned off automatically.
  - Turn on the camera power again.
- Operation has ceased in a low temperature outside of the camera usage temperature range.
  - Remove the batteries from the camera. Warm the camera and battery by placing them in your pocket and then immediately before shooting, place the battery in the camera and then shoot.

## The camera suddenly stops working while in use.

- The camera stopped due to a malfunction.
  - Remove /re-insert battery and switch the camera on.

## The camera buttons do not operate.

- Camera malfunction.
  - Remove/re-insert battery and switch the camera on.

## Camera does not take images when pressing the Shutter button.

- There is insufficient memory capacity.
  - Delete unnecessary image files.
- The memory card has not been formatted.
  - Format the memory card (p.84).
- The memory card is exhausted.
  - Insert a new memory card.
- The memory card is locked.
  - Refer to [Card Locked!] error message.
- The camera's power is off.
  - Turn the camera power on.
- The battery is exhausted.
  - Insert fresh batteries. (p.15)
- Battery is inserted incorrectly with the polarities reversed.
  - Insert the battery according to the polarity marks (+, -).

## The images are unclear.

- A picture was taken of a subject without setting an appropriate macro mode.
  - Select an appropriate macro mode to take a clear image.
- Taking a picture beyond the flash range.
  - Take a picture within the flash range.
- The lens is smudged or dirty.
  - Clean the lens.

# Before contacting a service centre

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## The flash does not fire.

- Flash off mode has been selected.
  - Dis-engage flash off mode.
- The camera mode can't use the flash.
  - Refer to the FLASH instruction. (p.35-36)

## Incorrect date and time is displayed

- The date and time have been set incorrectly or the camera has adopted the default settings.
  - Reset the date and time correctly.

## A card error has occurred while the memory card is in the camera.

- Incorrect memory card format.
  - Re-format the memory card.

## The images don't play back.

- Incorrect file name. (Violation of DCF format)
  - Do not change the image file name.

## Colour of image is different to the original scene.

- White balance or effect setting is incorrect.
  - Select appropriate White balance and effect.

## Images are too bright.

- Exposure is excessive.
  - Reset exposure compensation.

## Image distortion appears in the picture.

- The camera you have purchased uses a wide angle lens and this may cause image distortion. This is a special feature of the product.

## No image on external monitor.

- The external monitor has not been connected properly with the camera.
  - Check the connection cables.
- There are incorrect files in the memory card.
  - Insert a memory card that has correct files.

## When using the PC's explorer, the [Removable Disk] file does not show.

- Cable connection is incorrect.
  - Check the connection.
- The camera is off.
  - Turn the camera on.
- The operating system is not Windows 2000, XP, Vista / Mac OS 10.3. Alternatively the PC does not support USB.
  - Install Windows 2000, XP, Vista / Mac OS 10.3 to PC that supports USB.



## Before contacting a service centre

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### A part of the LCD screen does not occasionally turn on or a spot appears.

- Although the LCD screen is manufactured with high precision technology, the precision pixels are not occasionally lighted or the red, white and blue spots appear.  
This phenomenon does not affect the quality of the recorded image and it is not a malfunction.

### A vertical line appears on the LCD screen when taking a picture of a bright object.

- If a subject is exposing bright lights, a gray, black, red or purple vertical line may appear.  
This is a phenomenon called smear and it does not affect the quality of the recorded image. This is not a malfunction.

## FAQ

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Please check the following if the USB connection malfunctions.

### Case 1

USB cable is not connected or it is not the supplied USB cable.

→ Connect the supplied USB cable.

### Case 2

The camera is not recognised by your PC.

Sometimes, the camera may appear under [Unknown Devices] in Device Manager.

→ Turn off the camera, remove the USB cable, plug in the USB cable again, and then turn on the camera.

### Case 3

There is an unexpected error during file transfer.

→ Turn the camera power off and on again. Transfer the file again.

### Case 4

When using the USB hub.

→ There may be a problem in connecting the camera to the PC through the USB hub if the PC and the hub are not compatible. Wherever possible, connect the camera to the PC directly.

# FAQ

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## Case 5

Are other USB cables connected to the PC?

- The camera may malfunction when it is connected to the PC at the same time as another USB cable. In this case, disconnect the other USB cable, and connect only one USB cable to the camera.

## Case 6

When I open the Device Manager (by clicking Start → (Settings)

→ Control Panel → (Performance and Maintenance) → System → (Hardware) → Device Manager), there are Unknown Devices or Other Devices entries with a yellow question mark(?) beside them or devices with an exclamation mark(!) beside them.

- Right-click on the entry with the question (?) or exclamation (!) mark and select "Remove". Restart the PC and connect the camera again.

## Case 7

In some security programs (Norton Anti Virus, V3, etc.), the computer may not recognise the camera as a removable disk.

- Stop the security programs and connect the camera to the computer. Refer to the security program instructions about how to temporarily disable the program.

## Case 8

The camera is connected to the USB port located on the front of the computer.

- When the camera is connected to the USB port located on the front of the computer, the computer may not recognise the camera. Connect the camera to the USB port located on the back of the computer.

## ■ When you can not playback the recorded movie clip on your computer.

- ※ When you can not playback the recorded movie clip on your computer, it is mostly caused by the video codec installed on the computer.

[How to playback the H.264(MPEG4.AVC) movie clips]

### • Using the QuickTime Player 7.5

Install the "QuickTime Player 7.5" provided in the CD.  
(The QuickTime Player 7.5 supports the H.264(MPEG4.AVC) compression for videos.)

→ Plays back using the "QuickTime Player 7.5".

### • How to use with installing United Codec

We recommend that install the latest United Codec. (Recommendable Codec : K-Lite Codec Pack Full latest version)

→ Plays back using the "video player."

(When installed K-lite codec with its full version, the Media Player Classic or Window Media Player 11 is recommended)

- ※ "QuickTime Player 7.5", "K-lite United Codec full version" should be installed in Windows ServicePack2 or later.

- ※ Although the computer is guaranteed as operated, the playback might be intermittent depending on an user's computer.

# FAQ

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## ■ When the DirectX 9.0c or later is not installed

→ Install the DirectX 9.0c or later

- 1) Insert the CD provided with the camera
- 2) Run the windows explorer and select the [CD-ROM drive:\ DirectX] folder and click the DXSETUP.exe file. The DirectX will be installed. Visit the following site for downloading the DirectX.<http://www.microsoft.com/directx>

## ■ If a PC connected with the camera stops responding while Windows is starting.

→ In this case, disconnect the PC and the camera and Windows will start. If the problem happens continuously, set the Legacy USB Support to disable and re-start the PC. The Legacy USB Support is in the BIOS setup menu. (The BIOS setup menu differs from the PC manufacturers and some BIOS menus don't have Legacy USB Support) If you can't change the menu by yourself, contact to the PC manufacturer or BIOS manufacturer.

## ■ If the movie clip can't be deleted, or the removable disk can't be extracted or an error message displays during the file transfer.

- If you install only the Samsung Master, the problems mentioned above occasionally happen.
- Close the Samsung Master program by clicking the [Samsung Master] icon on the Taskbar.
  - Install all the application programs included in the software CD.

## ■ When the screen ratio of movie player does not meet with monitor.

→ If the resolution of monitor is smaller than the resolution of recorded movie clip, the screen ratio of movie player may not meet with monitor. Using the menu of movie player, you can adjust the screen ratio.
