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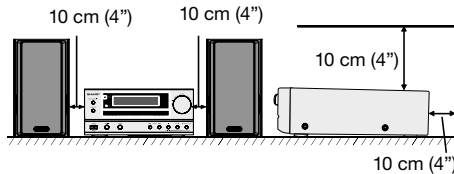
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## Precautions

### General

### \*2 About the JPEG file format

JPEG is a type of file format for storing still-image files (photos, illustrations, etc.). The Unit lets you play JPEG format still-image files.

### File formats that are not compatible.

- Still images in formats other than JPEG (such as TIFF) cannot be played.
- There may be some files that cannot be played even if they are in JPEG format.
- Progressive JPEG files cannot be played.
- Moving image files as well as Motion JPEG format files cannot be played, even though they are JPEG files.

### Other files that cannot be played back.

- You may not be able to play some still images which you have created, touched up, copied or otherwise edited on your computer.
- You may not be able to play some still images you have processed (rotated or saved by overwriting other images you have imported from the Internet or e-mail).

### You may experience one or more of the following symptoms when playing files.

- It may take some time to play files depending on the number of folders, number of files and volume of data involved.
- EXIF information will not be displayed. EXIF stands for Exchangeable Image File Format, and is a standard for storing interchange information in image files, especially those using JPEG compression. (Refer to <http://exif.org> for more information.)

### \*3 About the MP3 file format

MP3 files are audio data compressed in the MPEG1/2 Audio layer-3 file format. "MP3 files" have ".mp3" as extensions. (Some files that have ".mp3" extensions or files that have not been recorded in MP3 format will produce noise or cannot be played.)

### Playing the MP3 file format

- The MP3 files are not played in the order they were recorded.
- It is recommended to record data at a lower speed as data recorded at a fast speed can produce noise and may not be able to be played.
- The more folders there are, the longer the reading time.
- Depending on the folder tree, reading MP3 files can take time.
- The playing time may not be correctly displayed during MP3 file playback.

### The following files cannot be played on this unit.

- When both Audio CD [CD-DA] format and JPEG/MP3 file formats are recorded on a disc. (The disc is recognised to be an Audio CD [CD-DA] only tracks in Audio CD [CD-DA] format are played back.)
- Multi-session discs cannot be played.

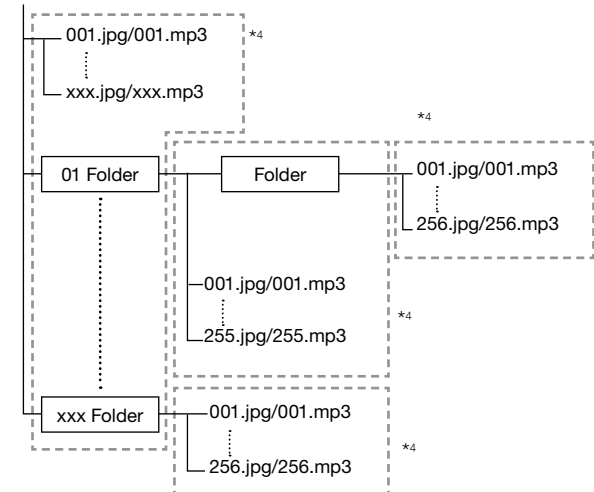

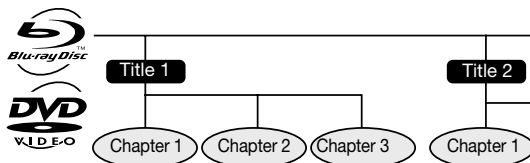

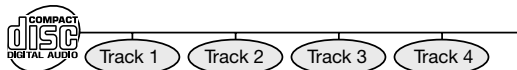
#### Title, Chapter and Track

- Audio CDs are divided into “Tracks”. You can think of a “Track” as one tune on an Audio CD. (See Example 2.)

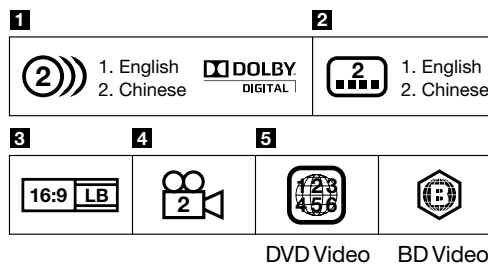


Example 2: Audio CD



#### Icons Used on BD/DVD Video Disc Cases

The back of the case of a BD/DVD that is commercially available usually contains various information about the contents of the disc.



#### 1 Audio tracks and audio formats

BD and DVD discs can contain up to 8 separate tracks with a different language on each. The first in the list is the original track. This section also details the audio format of each soundtrack – Dolby Digital, DTS, MPEG etc.

#### Dolby Digital

A sound system developed by Dolby Laboratories Inc. that gives movie theatre ambience to audio output when the Unit is connected to a Dolby Digital processor or amplifier.

#### DTS

DTS is a digital sound system developed by DTS, Inc. for use in cinemas.

#### Linear PCM

Linear PCM is a signal recording format used for Audio CDs and on some DVD and Blu-ray discs. The sound on Audio CDs is recorded at 44.1 kHz with 16 bits. (Sound is recorded between 48 kHz with 16 bits and 96 kHz with 24 bits on DVD video discs and between 48 kHz with 16 bits and 192 kHz with 24 bits on BD video discs.)

#### 2 Subtitle languages

This indicates the kind of subtitles.

#### 3 Screen aspect ratio

Movies are shot in a variety of screen modes.

#### 4 Camera angle

Recorded onto some BD/DVD discs are scenes which have been simultaneously shot from a number of different angles (the same scene is shot from the front, from the left side, from the right side, etc.).

#### 5 Region code

This indicates the region code (playable region code).





## Important Information

### ■ Disc Precautions

#### Be Careful of Scratches and Dust

- BD, DVD and CD discs are sensitive to dust, fingerprints and especially scratches. A scratched disc may not be able to be played back. Handle discs with care and store them in a safe place.

#### Proper Disc Storage

Place the disc in the centre of the disc case and store the case and disc upright.	
Avoid storing discs in locations subject to direct sunlight, close to heating appliances or in locations of high humidity.	
Do not drop discs or subject them to strong vibrations or impacts.	
Avoid storing discs in locations where there are large amounts of dust or moisture.	

#### Handling Precautions

- If the surface is soiled, wipe gently with a soft, damp (water only) cloth. When wiping discs, always move the cloth from the centre hole toward the outer edge.



- Do not use record cleaning sprays, benzene, thinner, static electricity prevention liquids or any other solvent.
- Do not touch the surface.
- Do not stick paper or adhesive labels to the disc.

## ■ Aerial connection

### Supplied FM aerial:

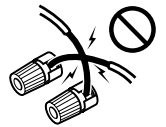
Use an external FM aerial (75 ohms coaxial cable) for better reception. When an external FM aerial is used, disconnect the supplied FM aerial wire.

## ■ Speaker connection

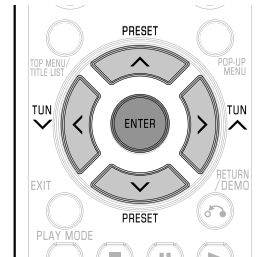

- 1 Clear all the programmed contents. [Refer to "Factory reset, clearing all memory" on page 42 for details.]
- 2 Perform "Setting the clock" from step 1 onwards.

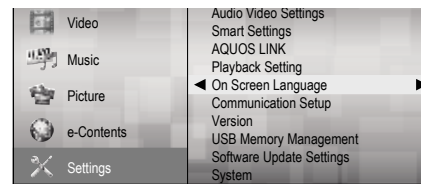

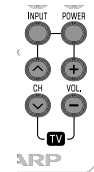

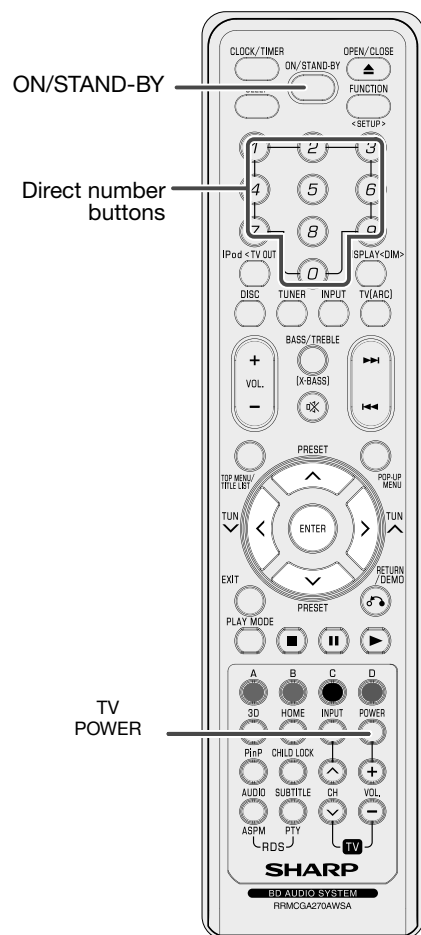

### ■ Using AQUOS LINK

#### Controlling the unit using AQUOS LINK

##### What is AQUOS LINK?

Using the HDMI CEC (Consumer Electronics Control), with AQUOS LINK you can interactively operate this unit with your SHARP AQUOS TV.

##### What you can do with AQUOS LINK

When you connect this unit to the LCD TV compatible with AQUOS LINK using an HDMI cable, you can perform the functions listed below. (See page 9 for connecting to the HDMI terminal).

##### Automatic input select function

When you start playback of this unit, the input selector of the LCD TV will automatically switch to the LCD TV input terminal connected to the unit and the playback image will appear on the screen, even if you are watching a TV programme.

##### Automatic power off function

Turning off the LCD TV under different condition will set this unit as below:

Condition	Unit will turn off automatically
DISC function	YES (during stop mode only)
TV(ARC) function	YES
Other functions (iPod/USB-2 (iPod)/Tuner/Audio In/Line In/Digital In)	NO

##### Automatic power on function

When you switch to the LCD TV input terminal connected to this unit, the power of this unit will be turned on automatically.

##### AQUOS PURE MODE

When you connect this unit to an AQUOS LCD TV compatible with AQUOS LINK and set "AQUOS LINK" to "Yes", images automatically adjusted to the most suitable image quality for the AQUOS TV are output from the HDMI OUT terminal of this unit.

##### Note:

- In order to make AQUOS LINK available, set "AQUOS LINK" to "Yes" (See page 28).

Refer to the Operation Manual of the TV for details regarding setup.

### ■ Audio Return Channel (ARC) (Audio Return Channel submenu)

The audio return channel (ARC) enables an HDMI ARC-capable TV to send the audio stream to the HDMI OUT socket of this unit. To use this function, press TV (ARC) button on the remote control.

### ■ Using 3D

This sets output of 3D images.

To view 3D images, playback of 3D content (3D BD video) is necessary with a 3D compatible TV and 3D glasses in addition to this unit.



Press **3D** to change to the 3D mode.

- Each time the button is pressed, the mode switches between "Auto(3D)" and "2D".
- The status of the selected mode will be displayed on the TV screen.

**Auto:** Video signals are output as 3D when 3D content (3D BD video) is played or as 2D when 2D content is played.

**2D:** Even if 3D content (3D BD video) is played, video signals are output as 2D at all times.

- This setting (Auto(3D)/2D) can also be performed using the menu screen (See page 28).

##### Notes:

- The 3D mode can be switched only when playback is stopped.
- Depending on the connected TV, the images during playback may switch to 2D images due to changes in the resolution, etc. Make sure the 3D image setting is performed on the TV.
- The 3D images may not be output as set in "HDMI Video Out".

  - When loading a disc containing 3D content (3D BD video) with “Yes” selected in the “3D Notice” setting (page 29), playback will be stopped and the 3D notice will be displayed on the TV screen. In such cases, press ENTER for confirmation, and then playback will start.
- 2 Press ► if playback does not begin automatically or playback is stopped.

### Note:

- The disc load time may vary depending on the disc.

### Regarding playback of BD video discs

- Some of the newly released BD video discs cannot be played back unless you update the unit software to the latest version. Therefore, it may be required to update the software of the unit.
- Refer to pages 31–34 for more information regarding software updates for the unit.

### To stop playback

Press ■.

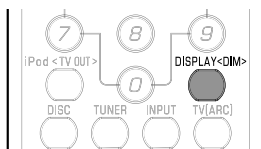
### Resume playback function

For BD-Video discs compatible with BONUSVIEW, the functions of Picture in Picture and Virtual Package are available. For BD-LIVE compatible discs, you can enjoy a variety of functions via the Internet in addition to the BONUSVIEW functions.

Virtual Package/BD-LIVE data is saved in Local Storage (USB memory device connected to this Unit). To enjoy these functions, connect a USB memory device (2GB or greater) supporting USB 2.0 High Speed (480Mbit/s) to the USB1 terminal on this unit.

- USB memory device can be used only on USB 1 terminal. (When you insert or remove a USB memory device, be sure to turn the main power off and make sure that "Quick Start" is set to "No" (See page 28).)

#### Rear



- If there is insufficient storage space, the data will not be copied/downloaded. Delete unneeded data or use a new USB memory device.
- If a USB memory device containing other data (previously recorded) is used, the video and audio may not play back properly.
- If the USB memory device is disconnected from this unit during playback of Virtual Package/BD-LIVE data, playback of the disc will stop.
- Some time may be required for the data to load (read/write).

### Dynamic Range Control

This lets you adjust the range between the loudest and softest sounds (dynamic range) for playback at average volume. Use this when it is hard to hear dialogue.

Normal: The same audio output range is played as the original recorded audio output range.

Shift\*: When Dolby Digital audio is played back, the dynamic range of the audio is adjusted so that the dialogue portion can be heard easily. (If the audio sounds abnormal, set to “Normal”.)

Auto: When you play back audio in the Dolby TrueHD format, the dynamic range is automatically adjusted.

\* Lower the audio volume before setting. If you do not do so, the speakers may emit a loud sound or excessive output may be applied to the speakers.

### SUPER PICTURE

This enhances the quality of video streaming images with pixel by pixel processing technology.

- During iPod or iPhone video playback, press and hold iPod <TV OUT> button will not toggle video out display between iPod and TV.

#### Caution:

- Unplug all accessories for the iPod or iPhone before inserting it into the docking station.

### Navigating the iPod, iPhone or iPad menus

- 1 Press the TOP MENU/TITLE LIST button to view the menu on iPod, iPhone or iPad unit. Press it again to go back to previous menu.
- 2 Use the PRESET (∨ or ∧) button to select an item on the menu and then press ENTER button.

#### Note:

When navigating the iPod, iPhone or iPad menu with remote control, do not operate any of the buttons on the iPod or iPhone unit. The volume level is adjusted by pressing the VOL (+ or -) button on the remote control or VOLUME (+ or -) knob on the main unit. Adjusting the volume on the iPod, iPhone or iPad units give no effect.

#### iPod, iPhone and iPad operations:

The operations described below depend on the generation iPod, iPhone and iPad you are using.

#### System on operation:

When the main unit is powered on, the iPod, iPhone or iPad units will automatically power on when docked or connected in the unit.

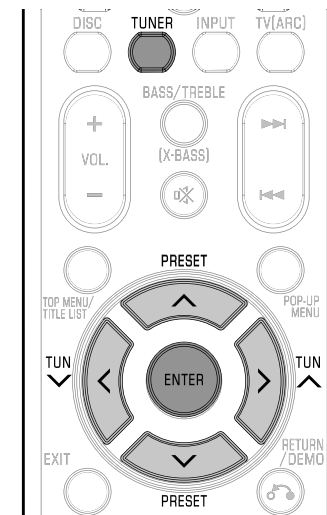
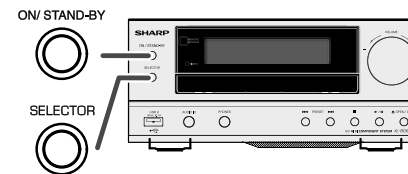
#### System off (stand-by operation):

When the main unit is turned to stand-by mode, the docked iPod, iPhone or connected iPad unit will automatically turn to stand-by mode.

## Listening to the radio



### Tuning

- 1 Press the ON/STAND-BY button to turn the power on.
- 2 Press the TUNER button repeatedly to select FM Stereo or FM Mono.
- 3 Press the TUNING (∨ or ∧) button on the remote control to tune in to the desired station.

#### Manual tuning:

Press the TUNING (∨ or ∧) button repeatedly to tune in to the desired station.

#### Auto tuning:

When the TUNING (∨ or ∧) button is pressed for more than 0.5 seconds, scanning will start automatically and the tuner will stop at the first receivable broadcast station.

#### Notes:

- When radio interference occurs, auto scan tuning may stop automatically at that point.
- Auto scan tuning will skip weak signal stations.
- To stop the auto tuning, press the TUNING (∨ or ∧) button again.
- When an RDS (Radio Data System) station is tuned in, the frequency will be displayed first, and then the RDS indicator will light up. Finally, the station name will appear.
- Full auto tuning can be achieved for RDS stations "ASPM", see page 38.

## Listening to the radio (continued)

### To receive an FM stereo transmission:

- Press the TUNER button to select stereo mode and “ST” indicator will be displayed. “>•••” and “•” will appear when an FM broadcast is in stereo.
- If the FM reception is weak, press the TUNER button to extinguish the “ST” indicator. The reception changes to monaural, and the sound becomes clearer.

### Memorising a station

You can store 40 FM stations in memory and recall them at the push of a button. (Preset tuning)

- 1 Perform steps 1 - 3 in “Tuning”.
- 2 Press the ENTER button.



- 3 Within 30 seconds, press the PRESET (∨ or ∧) button to select the preset channel number. Store the stations in memory, in order, starting with preset channel 1.
- 4 Within 30 seconds, press the ENTER button to store that station in memory. If the “ENTER” and preset number indicators disappear before the station is memorised, repeat the operation from step 2.
- 5 Repeat steps 1 - 4 to set other stations, or to change a preset station. When a new station is stored in the memory, the station previously memorised for that preset channel number will be erased.

#### Note:

The backup function protects the memorised stations for a few hours should there be a power failure or the AC power lead become disconnected.

### To recall a memorised station

- 1 Press the PRESET (∨ or ∧) button to select the desired station.

### To scan the preset stations

The stations saved in the memory can be scanned automatically. (Preset memory scan)

- 1 Press the PRESET (∨ or ∧) button for more than 0.5 seconds. The preset number will flash and the programmed stations will be tuned in sequentially, for 5 seconds each.
- 2 Press the PRESET (∨ or ∧) button again when the desired station is located.

### To erase entire preset memory

- 1 Press the ON/STAND-BY button to enter the stand-by mode.
- 2 Whilst pressing down the ◀◀ button, press the ON/STAND-BY button until “Tuner Clear” appears.



## Using the Radio Data System (RDS)

RDS is a broadcasting service which a growing number of FM stations provide. These FM stations send additional signals along with their regular programme signals. They send their station names, and information about the type of programme such as sport, music, etc.

When tuned to an RDS station, “RDS” and the station name will be displayed.

“TP” (Traffic Programme) will appear on the display when the received broadcast carries traffic information, and “TA” (Traffic Announcement) will appear whilst a traffic information is on air.

“PTYI” (Dynamic PTY Indicator) will appear whilst the Dynamic PTY station is received.

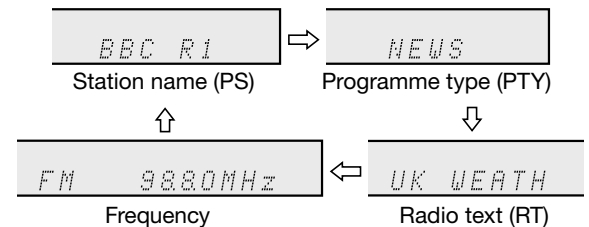
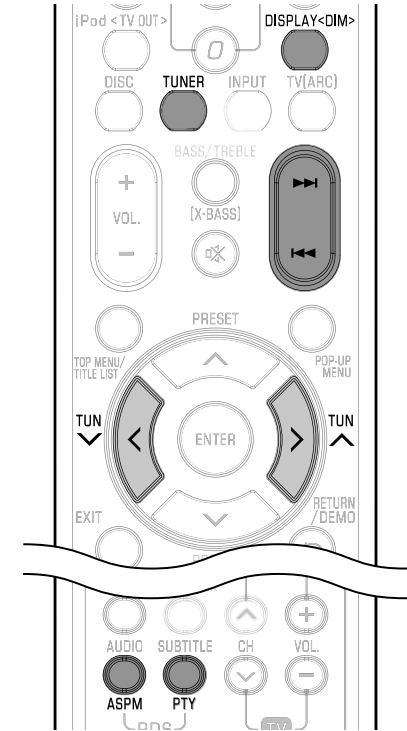

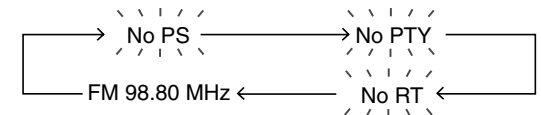
You can control the RDS by using the buttons on the remote control only.

### Information provided by RDS

Each time the DISPLAY <DIM> button is pressed, the display will switch as follows:



When tuning in to a station other than an RDS station or to an RDS station which sends weak signal, the display will change in the following order:



## Using the Radio Data System (RDS) (continued)

### Using the Auto Station Programme Memory (ASPM)

Whilst in the ASPM operation mode, the tuner will automatically search for new RDS stations. Up to 40 stations can be stored.

If you have already stored some stations in memory, the number of new stations you can store will be less.

1 Press the TUNER button on the remote control or SELECTOR button repeatedly on the main unit to select TUNER function.

2 Press and hold down the RDS ASPM button on the remote control.  
1 After "ASPM" has flashed for about 4 seconds, scanning will start (87.50 - 108.00 MHz).



2 When an RDS station is found, "RDS" will appear for a short time and the station will be stored in memory.



3 After scanning, the number of stations stored in memory will be displayed for 4 seconds, and then "END" will appear for 4 seconds.



#### To stop the ASPM operation before it is complete:

Press the RDS ASPM button whilst it is scanning for stations.

The stations which are already stored in memory will be kept there.

#### Notes:

- If the same station is broadcasting on different frequencies, the strongest frequency will be stored in memory.
- Any station which has the same frequency as the one stored in memory will not be stored.
- If 40 stations have already been stored in memory, the scan will be aborted. If you want to redo the ASPM operation, erase the preset memory.
- If no station have been stored in memory, "END" will appear for about 4 seconds.
- If the RDS signals are very weak, station names may not be stored in memory.
- The same station name can be stored in different channels.
- In a certain area or during certain time periods, the station names may temporarily be different.

### Notes: for RDS operation

If any of the following events occur, it does not mean that the unit is faulty:

- "PS", "No PS" and a station name appear alternately, and the unit does not operate properly.
- If a particular station is not broadcasting properly or a station is conducting tests, the RDS reception function may not work properly.
- When you receive an RDS station whose signal is too weak, information like the station name may not be displayed.

- "No PS", "No PTY" or "No RT" will flash for about 5 seconds, and then the frequency will be displayed.

#### Notes: for radio text:

- The first 14 characters of the radio text will appear for 4 seconds and then they will scroll across the display.
- If you tune in to an RDS station which is not broadcasting any radio text, "No RT" will be displayed when you switch to the radio text position.
- Whilst radio text data is received or when the text contents change, "RT" will be displayed.

### To recall stations in memory

#### To specify programmed types and select stations (PTY search):

You can search a station by specifying the programme type (news, sports, traffic programme, etc. ... see pages 38-39) from the stations in memory.

1 Press the TUNER button on the remote control or SELECTOR button repeatedly on the main unit to select TUNER function.

2 Press the RDS PTY button on the remote control.



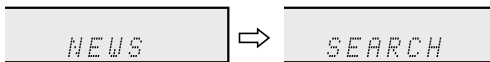
"SELECT" and "PTY TI" will appear alternately for about 6 seconds.

3 Within 6 seconds, press the PRESET (v or ^) button to select the programme type.



Each time the button is pressed, the programme type will appear. If the button is held down for more than 0.5 seconds, the programme type will appear continuously.

4 Whilst the selected programme type is flashing (within 6 seconds), press the RDS PTY button again.



After the selected programme type has been lit for 2 seconds, "SEARCH" will appear, and the search operation will start.

#### Notes:

- If the display has stopped flashing, start again from step 2. If the unit finds a desired programme type, the corresponding channel number will lit for about 8 seconds, and then the station name will remain it.
- If you want to listen to the same programme type of another station, press the RDS PTY button whilst the channel number or station name is flashing. The unit will look for the next station.
- If no station can be found, "NOT FOUND" will appear for 4 seconds.

#### If you select the traffic programme:

If you select the traffic programme (TP) in step 3, "TP" will appear.

(This does not mean that you can listen to the traffic information at that time.)

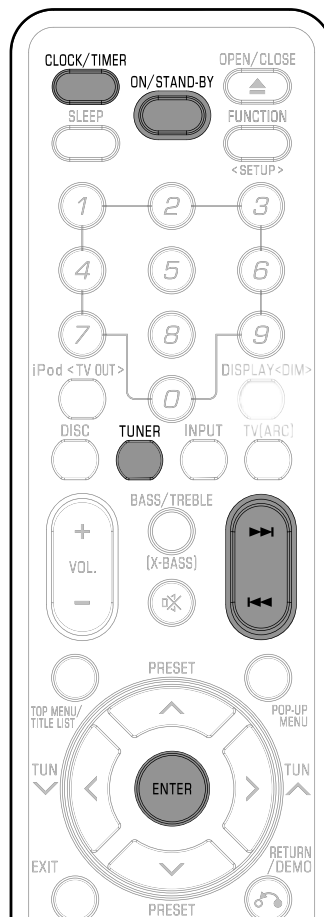
When the traffic information is broadcast, "TA" will appear.

#### Descriptions of the PTY (Programme Type) codes, TP (Traffic Programme) and TA (Traffic Announcement)

You can search for and receive the following PTY, TP and TA signals.

<b>NEWS</b>	Short accounts of facts, events and publicly expressed views, reportage and actuality.
<b>AFFAIRS</b>	Topical programme expanding or enlarging upon the news, generally in different presentation style or concept, including debate, or analysis.
<b>INFO</b>	Programmes whose purpose is to impart advice in the widest sense.
<b>SPORT</b>	Programme concerned with any aspect of sport.
<b>EDUCATE</b>	Programme intended primarily to educate, of which the formal element is fundamental.
<b>DRAMA</b>	All radio plays and serials.
<b>CULTURE</b>	Programmes concerned with any aspect of national or regional culture, including language, theatre, etc.
<b>SCIENCE</b>	Programmes about the natural sciences and technology.
<b>VARIED</b>	Used for mainly speech-based programmes usually of light-entertainment nature, not covered by other categories. Examples include: quizzes, panel games, personality interviews.
<b>POP M</b>	Commercial music, which would generally be considered to be of current popular appeal, often featuring in current or recent record sales charts.
<b>ROCK M</b>	Contemporary modern music, usually written and performed by young musicians.
<b>EASY M</b>	Current contemporary music considered to be "easy-listening", as opposed to Pop, Rock or Classical, or one of the specialised music styles, Jazz, Folk or Country. Music in this category is often but not always, vocal, and usually of short duration.
<b>LIGHT M</b>	Classical music for general, rather than specialist appreciation. Examples of music in this category are instrumental music, and vocal or choral works.
<b>CLASSICS</b>	Performances of major orchestral works, symphonies, chamber music, etc., and including Grand Opera.
<b>OTHER M</b>	Musical styles not fitting into any of the other categories. Particularly used for specialist music of which Rhythm & Blues and Reggae are examples.
<b>WEATHER</b>	Weather reports and forecasts and meteorological information.
<b>FINANCE</b>	Stock Market reports, commerce, trading, etc.

<b>CHILDREN</b>	For programmes targeted at a young audience, primarily for entertainment and interest, rather than where the objective is to educate.
<b>SOCIAL</b>	Programmes about people and things that influence them individually or in groups. Includes: sociology, history, geography, psychology and society.
<b>RELIGION</b>	Any aspect of beliefs and faiths, involving a God or Gods, the nature of existence and ethics.
<b>PHONE IN</b>	Involving members of the public expressing their views either by phone or at a public forum.
<b>TRAVEL</b>	Features and programmes concerned with travel to near and far destinations, package tours and travel ideas and opportunities. Not for use for announcements about problems, delays, or roadworks affecting immediate travel where TP/TA should be used.
<b>LEISURE</b>	Programmes concerned with recreational activities in which the listener might participate. Examples include, Gardening, Fishing, Antique collecting, Cooking, Food & Wine, etc.
<b>JAZZ</b>	Polyphonic, syncopated music characterised by improvisation.
<b>COUNTRY</b>	Songs which originate from, or continue the musical tradition of the American Southern States. Characterised by a straightforward melody and narrative story line.
<b>NATION M</b>	Current Popular Music of the Nation or Region in that country's language, as opposed to International "Pop" which is usually US or UK inspired and in English.
<b>OLDIES</b>	Music from the so-called "golden age" of popular music.
<b>FOLK M</b>	Music which has its roots in the musical culture of a particular nation, usually played on acoustic instruments. The narrative or story may be based on historical events or people.
<b>DOCUMENT</b>	Programme concerned with factual matters, presented in an investigative style.
<b>TEST</b>	Broadcast when testing emergency broadcast equipment or receivers.
<b>ALARM!</b>	Emergency announcement made under exceptional circumstances to give warning of events causing danger of a general nature.
<b>TP</b>	Broadcasts which carry traffic announcements.
<b>TA</b>	Traffic announcements are being broadcast.



### Timer playback:

The unit turns on and plays the desired source (DISC, TUNER, USB-2 (iPod), AUDIO IN, LINE IN, DIGITAL IN) at a preset time.

**This unit has 2 types of timer: ONCE TIMER and DAILY TIMER.**

#### Once timer:

Once timer play works for one time only at a preset time.

(“☉” indicator).

#### Daily timer:

Daily timer play works at the same preset time every day that we set. For example, set the timer as a wake-up call every morning.

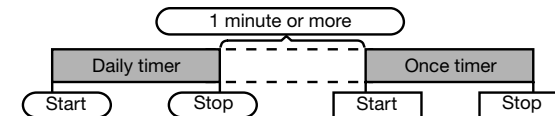
(“DAILY” indicator).

#### Using the once timer and daily timer in combination:

For example, use the once timer to listen a radio programme, and use the daily timer to wake up.

**1** Set the daily timer (pages 39–40).

**2** Set the once timer (pages 39–40).



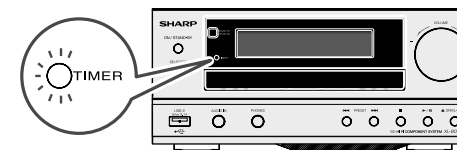
### ■ Timer playback

#### Before setting timer:

- Check that the clock is set to the correct time (refer to page 13). If it is not set, you cannot use the timer function.
- For timer playback: Plug in USB or load discs or dock iPod to be played.



- 1 Press the ON/STAND-BY button to turn the power on.
- 2 Press and hold the CLOCK/TIMER button.
- 3 Within 10 seconds, press the ◀◀ or ▶▶ button to select “Once” or “Daily”, and press the ENTER button.
- 4 Within 10 seconds, press the ◀◀ or ▶▶ button to select “Timer Set”, and press the ENTER button.
- 5 To select the timer playback source (DISC, TUNER, USB-2 (iPod), iPod, DIGITAL IN, AUDIO IN, LINE IN, TV ARC), press the ◀◀ or ▶▶ button. Press the ENTER button. When you select the tuner, select a station by pressing the ◀◀ or ▶▶ button, and then press the ENTER button. If a station has not been programmed, “No Preset” will be displayed and timer setting will be cancelled.
- 6 To adjust the day, press the ◀◀ or ▶▶ button and then press the ENTER button.
- 7 Press the ENTER button to adjust the hour. Press the ◀◀ or ▶▶ button and then press the ENTER button.
- 8 To adjust the minutes, press the ◀◀ or ▶▶ button and then press the ENTER button.
- 9 Set the time to finish as in steps 7 and 8 above.
- 10 Adjust the volume using the VOLUME control, and then press the ENTER button. Do not turn the volume up too high.
- 11 Press the ON/STAND-BY button to enter the power stand-by mode. The “TIMER” indicator lights up and the unit is ready for timer playback.



- 12 When the preset time is reached, playback will start. The volume will increase gradually until it reaches the preset volume. The timer indicator will blink during timer playback.



## Timer and sleep operation (Remote control only) (continued)

**13** When the timer end time is reached, the system will enter the power stand-by mode automatically.

### Once timer:

The timer will be cancelled.

### Daily timer:

The timer operates at the same time every selected day. It will continue until the daily timer setting is cancelled. Cancel the daily timer when it is not in use.

### Notes:

- When performing timer playback using another unit connected to the USB 2, AUDIO IN, LINE IN or DIGITAL IN socket select "USB-2 (iPod)" or "AUDIO IN" or "LINE IN" or "DIGITAL IN" in step 5.
- This unit will turn on or enter the power stand-by mode automatically. However, the connected unit will not turn on or off. To stop the timer playback, follow step "Cancelling the timer setting" of this page.

### Checking the timer setting:

- 1 Turn the power on and press and hold down the CLOCK/TIMER button.
- 2 Within 10 seconds, press the ◀◀ or ▶▶ button to select "Once" or "Daily", and press the ENTER button.
- 3 Within 10 seconds, press the ◀◀ or ▶▶ button to select "Timer Call", and press the ENTER button.

### Cancelling the timer setting:

- 1 Turn the power on and press and hold down the CLOCK/TIMER button.
- 2 Within 10 seconds, press the ◀◀ or ▶▶ button to select "Once" or "Daily", and press the ENTER button.
- 3 Within 10 seconds, press the ◀◀ or ▶▶ button to select "Timer Off", and press the ENTER button. Timer will be cancelled (the setting will not be cancelled).

### Reusing the memorised timer setting:

The timer setting will be memorised once it is entered. To reuse the same setting, perform the following operations.

- 1 Turn the power on and press and hold down the CLOCK/TIMER button.
- 2 Within 10 seconds, press the ◀◀ or ▶▶ button to select "Once" or "Daily", and press the ENTER button.
- 3 Within 10 seconds, press the ◀◀ or ▶▶ button to select "Timer On", and press the ENTER button.
- 4 Press the ON/STAND-BY button to enter the power stand-by mode.

## ■ Sleep operation

The radio, disc, iPod, USB, Audio In, Line In, TV (ARC) and Digital In can all be turned off automatically.

- 1 Play back the desired sound source.
- 2 Press the SLEEP button.
- 3 Within 5 seconds, press the Numeric button to set the time. (1 minute ~ 99 minutes)
- 4 "SLEEP" will appear.
- 5 The unit will enter the power stand-by mode automatically after the preset time has elapsed. The volume will be turned down 1 minute before the sleep operation finishes.

### To confirm the remaining sleep time:

- 1 Whilst "SLEEP" is indicated, press the SLEEP button.

### To cancel the sleep operation:

Press the ON/STAND-BY button whilst "SLEEP" is indicated. To cancel the sleep operation without setting the unit to the stand-by mode, proceed as follows.

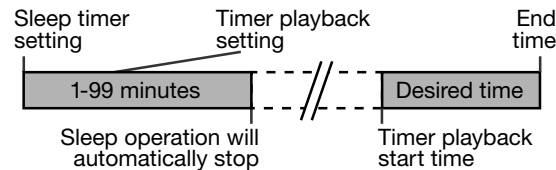
- 1 Whilst "SLEEP" is indicated, press the SLEEP button.
- 2 Within 5 seconds, press the "0" button twice until "SLEEP 00" appears.

## ■ To use timer and sleep operation together

### Sleep and timer playback:

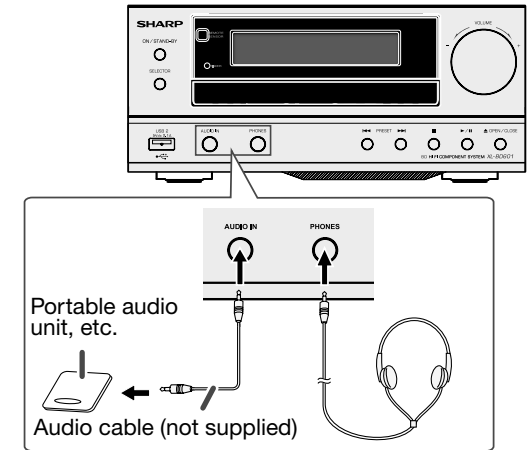
For example, you can fall asleep listening to the radio and wake up to iPod in the next morning.

- 1 Set the sleep time (see above, steps 1 - 5).
- 2 Whilst the sleep timer is set, set the timer playback (steps 2 - 9, page 39).



## Enhancing your system

The connection lead is not included. Purchase a commercially available lead as shown below.



## ■ Listening to the playback sounds of portable audio unit, etc.

- 1 Use a connection lead to connect the portable audio unit etc. to the AUDIO IN socket. When using video equipment, connect the audio output to this unit and the video output to a television.
- 2 Press the ON/STAND-BY button to turn the power on.
- 3 Press the INPUT button on the remote control or SELECTOR button repeatedly on main unit to select AUDIO IN function.
- 4 Play the connected equipment. If volume level of the connected device is too high, sound distortion may occur. Should this happen, lower the volume of the connected device. If volume level is too low, increase the volume of the connected device.

### Note:

To prevent noise interference, place the unit away from the television.

## ■ Headphones

- Do not turn the volume on to full at switch on and listen to music at moderate levels. Excessive sound pressure from earphones and headphones can cause hearing loss.
- Before plugging in or unplugging the headphone, reduce the volume.
- Be sure your headphone has a 3.5 mm (1/8") diameter plug and impedance between 16 and 50 ohms. The recommended impedance is 32 ohms.
- Plugging in the headphone disconnects the speakers automatically. Adjust the volume using the VOLUME control.

### ■ Condensation

Sudden temperature changes, storage or operation in an extremely humid environment may cause condensation inside the cabinet (BD pickup, etc.) or on the transmitter on the remote control. Condensation can cause the unit to malfunction. If this happens, leave the power on with no disc in the unit until normal playback is possible (about 1 hour). Wipe off any condensation on the transmitter with a soft cloth before operating the unit.

### ■ If problem occurs

When this product is subjected to strong external interference (mechanical shock, excessive static electricity, abnormal supply voltage due to lightning, etc.) or if it is operated incorrectly, it may malfunction.

#### If such a problem occurs, do the following:

- 1 Set the unit to the stand-by mode and turn the power on again.
- 2 If the unit is not restored in the previous operation, unplug and plug in the unit again, and then turn the power on.

#### Note:

If neither operation above restores the unit, clear all the memory by resetting it.

### ■ Factory reset, clearing all memory

- 1 Press the ON/STAND-BY button to enter the power stand-by mode.
- 2 Whilst pressing down the OPEN/CLOSE button, press the ON/STAND-BY button until "Clear All" appears.

This operation will erase all data stored in memory including clock, timer settings and tuner preset.

### ■ Before transporting the unit

Remove the iPod, iPhone, iPad, USB memory device and disc from the unit. Then, set the unit to the power stand-by mode. Carrying the unit with iPod, iPhone, iPad or USB memory device left connected or discs left inside might damage the unit.

## Maintenance

### ■ Cleaning the cabinet

Periodically wipe the cabinet with a soft cloth and a diluted soap solution, then with a dry cloth.

### **AVCHD (page 3)**

AVCHD (Advanced Video Codec High Definition) refers to a recording format (specification) for digital video cameras which can record to a disc such as 8 cm DVD disc and play back digital high definition images.

### **BDAV (page 3)**

BDAV (Blu-ray Disc Audio/Visual, BD-AV) refers to one of the application formats used for writable Blu-ray discs such as BD-R, BD-RE, etc. BDAV is a recording format equivalent to DVD-VR (VR mode) of the DVD specifications.

### **BD-J application**

The BD-ROM format supports Java for interactive functions. "BD-J" offers content providers almost unlimited functionality when creating interactive BD-ROM titles.

### **BD-LIVE (page 19)**

A variety of interactive content is available from BD-LIVE compatible Blu-ray discs via the Internet.

### **BDMV (page 3)**

BDMV (Blu-ray Disc Movie, BD-MV) refers to one of the application formats used for BD-ROM which is one of the Blu-ray Disc specifications. BDMV is a recording format equivalent to DVD-video of the DVD specification.

### **BD-R (pages 3-4)**

A BD-R (Blu-ray Disc Recordable) is a recordable, write-once Blu-ray Disc. Since contents can be recorded and cannot be overwritten, a BD-R can be used to archive data or for storing and distributing video material.

### **BD-RE (pages 3-4)**

A BD-RE (Blu-ray Disc Rewritable) is a recordable and rewritable Blu-ray Disc.

### **BD-ROM (pages 3-4)**

BD-ROMs (Blu-ray Disc Read-Only Memory) are commercially produced discs. Other than conventional movie and video contents, these discs have enhanced features such as interactive content, menu operations using pop-up menus, selection of subtitle display, and slide shows. Although a BD-ROM may contain any form of data, most BD-ROM discs will contain movies in High Definition format for playback on Blu-ray Disc units.

### **Blu-ray Disc (BD) (page 3)**

A disc format developed for recording/playing high-definition (HD) video (for HDTV, etc.), and for storing large amounts of data. A single layer Blu-ray Disc holds up to 25 GB, and a dual-layer Blu-ray Disc holds up to 50 GB of data.

### **Chapter number (page 26)**

Sections of a movie or a music feature that are smaller than titles. A title is composed of several chapters. Some discs may only be comprised of a single chapter.

### **Control Panel (page 16)**

This function allows you to operate this unit using the TV remote control by displaying the control panel on the TV screen.

### **Copy guard**

This function prevents copying. You cannot copy discs marked by the copyright holder with a signal which prevents copying.

### **Deep Colour**

Deep Colour can reproduce rich colours, increasing the number of bits describing colours.

This Unit is compatible with Deep Colour. You can enjoy this function by connecting to a Deep Colour compatible TV using an HDMI cable.

### **Disc menu (page 19)**

This lets you select things like the subtitle language or audio format using a menu stored on the DVD video disc.

### **Dolby Digital (page 5)**

A sound system developed by Dolby Laboratories Inc. that gives movie theatre ambience to audio output when the product is connected to a Dolby Digital processor or amplifier.

### **Dolby Digital Plus (page 34)**

A sound system developed as an extension to Dolby Digital. This audio coding technology supports 7.1 multi-channel surround sound.

### **Dolby TrueHD (page 34)**

Dolby TrueHD is a lossless coding technology that supports up to 8 channels of multi-channel surround sound for the next generation optical discs. The reproduced sound is true to the original source bit-for-bit.

### **DTS (page 5)**

This is a digital sound system developed by DTS, Inc. for use in cinemas.

### **DTS-HD High Resolution Audio (page 34)**

DTS-HD High Resolution Audio is a new technology developed for the next generation high definition optical disc format.

### **DTS-HD Master Audio (page 34)**

DTS-HD Master Audio is a lossless audio compression technology developed for the next generation high definition optical disc format.

### **DTS-HD Master Audio | Essential**

DTS-HD Master Audio | Essential is a lossless audio compression technology developed for the next generation high definition optical disc format.

### **DVD upscaling (page 18)**

Upscaling (upconverting) refers to a function of various units and devices that enlarge the image size to fit the size of the screen of video equipments such as a TV.

### **DVD video (pages 3-4)**

A disc format that contains up to eight hours of moving pictures on a disc the same diameter as a CD. A single-layer single-sided DVD holds up to 4.7 GB; a double layer single-sided DVD, 8.5 GB; a single layer double-sided DVD, 9.4 GB; double-layer double-sided DVD, 17 GB. The MPEG 2 format was adopted for efficient video data compression. It is a variable rate technology that encodes the data to according to the status of the video for reproducing high-quality images. Audio information is recorded in a multi-channel format such as Dolby Digital, allowing for a realistic audio presence.

### **DVD+/-R (pages 3-4)**

A DVD+/-R is a recordable, write-once DVD. Since contents can be recorded and cannot be overwritten, a DVD+/-R can be used to

archive data or for storing and distributing video material. The DVD+/-R has two different formats: VR format and Video format. DVDs created in Video format have the same format as a DVD video, while discs created in VR (Video Recording) format allow the contents to be programmed or edited.

### **DVD+/-RW (pages 3-4)**

A DVD+/-RW is a recordable and rewritable DVD. The re-recordable feature makes editing possible. The DVD+/-RW has two different formats: VR format and Video format. DVDs created in Video format have the same format as a DVD video, while discs created in VR (Video Recording) format allow the contents to be programmed or edited.

### **HDMI (page 34)**

HDMI (High-Definition Multimedia Interface) is an interface that supports both video and audio on a single digital connection. The HDMI connection carries standard to high definition video signals and multi-channel audio signals to AV components such as HDMI equipped TVs, in digital form without degradation.

### **Interlace format**

Interlace format shows every other line of an image as a single "field" and is the standard method for displaying images on television. The even numbered field shows the even numbered lines of an image, and the odd numbered field shows the odd numbered lines of an image.

### **JPEG (pages 3-4, 22-23)**

JPEG (Joint Photographic Experts Group) is a still image data compression format and is used in most of digital cameras.

### **Linear PCM Sound (page 5)**

Linear PCM is a signal recording format used for Audio CDs and on some DVD and Blu-ray discs. The sound on Audio CDs is recorded at 44.1 kHz with 16 bits. (Sound is recorded between 48 kHz with 16 bits and 96 kHz with 24 bits on DVD video discs and between 48 kHz with 16 bits and 192 kHz with 24 bits on BD video discs.)

### **MP3 (pages 3-4, 22-23)**

MP3 files are audio data compressed in the MPEG1/2 Audio layer-3 file format. "MP3 files" have ".mp3" as extensions.

### **MPEG-2**

MPEG-2 (Moving Picture Experts Group phase 2) is one of the video data compression schemes, which is adopted for DVD videos and digital broadcasts worldwide. Some Blu-ray Discs also use high bitrate MPEG-2.

### **Multi Angle (page 25)**

This is a feature of DVD and BD video discs. In some discs, the same scene is shot from different angles, and these are stored in a single disc so you can enjoy playback from each angle. (This function can be enjoyed if the disc is recorded with multiple angles.)

### **Multi Audio (page 28)**

This is a feature of DVD and BD video discs. This function makes it possible to record different audio tracks for the same video, so you can enhance your enjoyment by switching the audio. (You can enjoy this function with discs recorded with multiple audio tracks.)

## Glossary (continued)

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### **Parental control (page 28)**

In some digital broadcasts and BD/DVD video discs, a control level for disc viewing is set depending on the age of the viewer. With this Unit, you can set the control level for viewing such broadcasts and discs.

### **Pop-up menu (pages 17, 19)**

An enhanced menu operation available on BD video discs. The pop-up menu appears when **POP-UP MENU** is pressed during playback, and can be operated while playback is in progress.

### **Progressive format**

Compared to the Interlace format that alternately shows every other line of an image (field) to create one frame, the Progressive format shows the entire image at once as a single frame. This means that while the Interlace format can show 30 frames/60 fields in one second, the Progressive format can show 60 frames in one second. The overall picture quality increases and still images, text, and horizontal lines appear sharper.

### **Region code (pages 3-4)**

Code identifying a geographic region of compatibility for a BD/DVD.

### **Resume playback (pages 18, 21)**

If you stop playback while it is in progress, the Unit stores the stop position in memory, and this function lets you playback from that point.

### **Skip (pages 17, 22, 24-26, 34)**

This returns to the start of the chapter (or track) being played, or skips to the next chapter (or track).

### **Subtitles (pages 5, 19, 25)**

These are the lines of text appearing at the bottom of the screen which translate or transcribe the dialogue. They are recorded on many DVD and BD video discs.

### **Time number (pages 18, 26)**

This indicates the play time which has elapsed from the start of a disc or a title. It can be used to find a specific scene quickly. (It may not work with some discs.)

### **Title number (pages 18, 26)**

These numbers are recorded on DVD and Blu-ray discs. When a disc contains two or more movies, these movies are numbered as title 1, title 2, etc.

### **Top menu (pages 17-19)**

In a BD/DVD video, this is the menu for selecting things like the chapter to be played back and the subtitle language. In some DVD videos, the top menu may be called the "Title Menu".

### **Track number (pages 5, 26)**

These numbers are assigned to the tracks which are recorded on audio CDs. They enable specific tracks to be located quickly.

### **x.v.Colour**

x.v.Colour reproduces a greater range of colour than before, showing almost all of the colours that the human eye can detect. (Applicable for JPEG files only with this system)

### **YouTube (page 34)**

YouTube is a website where users can upload and view video content, such as video clips and TV clips. You can watch the content streamed on your TV.
