All in beautiful HD for crisp details and vivid colours. Whether you are in another country or downstairs on the couch, check on your favourite people or places instantly.

Beautiful HD quality.

Watch your home or your favourite people and pets on your phone in crystal clear HD quality and enjoy crisp details and vivid colours. The 100-degree field of view lets you keep an eye on the whole room and everybody in it. Think of the cam as your second set of eyes around the house.

Never miss a moment.

Whether it's your cat stealing treats from the kitchen counter or somebody coming in the front door, with the cam's smart sound and motion alerts, you can be sure to know what's going on in your home. Receive a push-notification on your phone and open the MyCam app to watch the recorded footage or check the live view to see what happens.

Watch around the clock.

Check in on your little ones throughout the night from your phone without interrupting their sleep or know who is moving around in the living room. Night vision lets you see up to 5 meters in the dark so you can keep an eye on your loved ones around the clock. As soon as daylight enters the room, night vision turns off automatically and you can see everything in full-colour again.

Grab your phone and say goodnight to your child when you're not home or tell the dog to get off the sofa. With the cam's built-in microphone and speaker, you can not only listen in but also speak directly to your favourite people and pets. QR-Code Flyer

The QR-Code flyer contains the details needed to install your camera.



Important note: Do not throw this flyer away. The information in the flyer is unique per product and cannot be recovered by Sitecom. You will need this flyer again in case of any changes to your Wi-Fi home network (new router, changing Internet providers etc.).

WHAT YOU NEED

For the Wi-Fi Home Cam

- A wireless home network
- A free power socket

For the MyCam app

- An Android or iOS smartphone or tablet
- Android version 3.xx or higher
- iOS version higher 6.xx or higher

For the MyCam portal (optional)

- A computer with Internet Explorer or Firefox installed (neither Safari nor Google Chrome support Java, so they will not work with the MyCam portal).

SAFETY PRECAUTIONS

The Wi-Fi Home Cam is designed and manufactured with your safety in mind. In order to safely and effectively use the Wi-Fi Home Cam, please read the following before usage.

Usage Cautions

- Do not disassemble, repair or change the Wi-Fi Home Cam; any damage done will not be included in the warranty / repair policy.
- Do not let it come into contact with water or other liquids. If water is accidentally spilled on the Wi-Fi Home Cam, please use a dry cloth to absorb the spillage.
- Do not shake or hit the Wi-Fi Home Cam, do not press the buttons too hard and stay away from magnetic fields.
- If during electrostatic discharge or a strong electromagnetic field the product will malfunction, unplug the power cable. The product will return to normal performance the next time it is powered on.

Power

The Wi-Fi Home Cam's power voltage is DC 12V 2A/ (1A for the Wi-Fi Home Cam Mini).

- When using the Wi-Fi Home Cam, please connect the supplied AC adapter and USB cable to the Wi-Fi Home Cam's power jack.
- When placing the adapter cable, make sure it can't get damaged or be subject to pressure.
- To reduce the risk of electric shock, unplug the adapter first before cleaning it.
- Never connect the adapter to the Wi-Fi Home Cam in a humid or dusty area.
- Do not replace the adapter or cable's wire or connector.

Repair

If you experience any problems with your Wi-Fi Home Cam, please take it to the shop where you bought it or a qualified repair centre. Never repair the Wi-Fi Home Cam yourself, you might damage the Wi-Fi Home Cam or endanger yourself.

Disposing of the Wi-Fi Home Cam

When you dispose the Wi-Fi Home Cam, be sure to dispose it appropriately. Some countries may regulate disposal of an electrical device, please consult with your local authority.

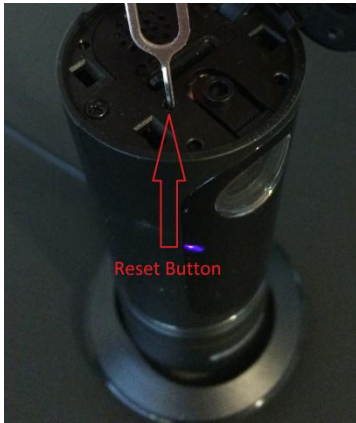

INSTALL YOUR WI-FI HOME CAM

Step 1: Download the app.

1. Go to the App Store / Google Play and search for the 'MyCam' app.
2. Download and install the app.



Info: Do not open the MyCam app yet. Wait until after step 3. (If you have already opened the app, close it completely. Check your device manual to see how.)

Step 2: Connect the camera to mains power

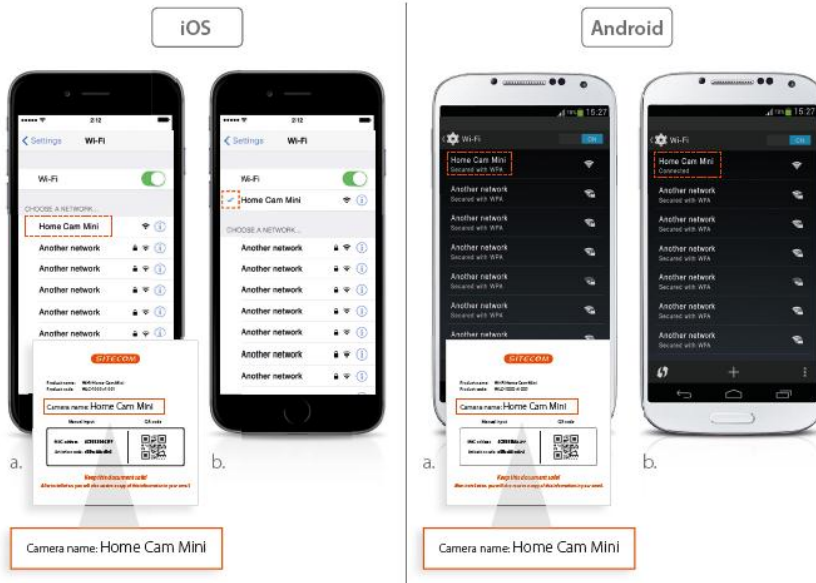
1. Connect the cam to the power socket with the included power adapter and USB cable.
2. Wait one minute so that the camera can start up.



Tip: Use a socket close to your (modem) router. You can move the cam later when it's fully setup.

Step 3: Select the Wi-Fi Home Cam in your Wi-Fi settings

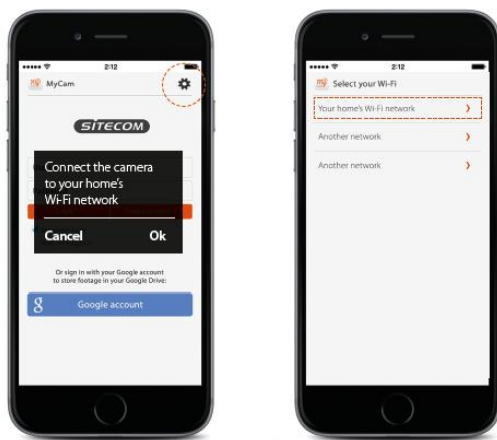
1. Go to settings on your iPhone / Android phone
2. Click 'Wi-Fi'.
3. Select "Home Cam Mini / Home Cam Twist" from the list of available networks.



Info: At this stage, this is an unsecured network, no password is required. After the installation, the Wi-Fi Home Cam will be connected to your home network and this network will no longer be visible.

Step 4: Connect the camera to your Wi-Fi network

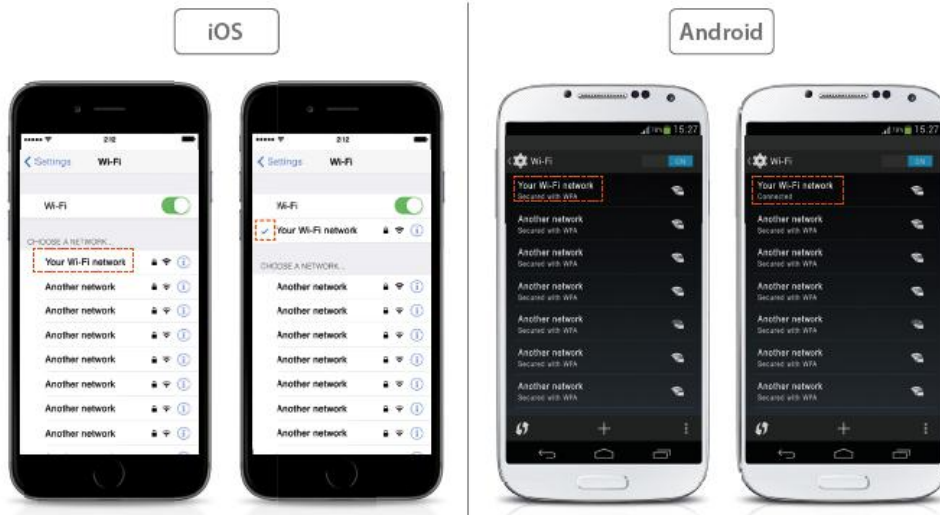
1. Open the MyCam app.
2. Click 'OK' in the pop-up to start the installation procedure.
Don't see the pop-up? Click the gearwheel symbol in the corner
3. Select your Wi-Fi home network from the list of available networks.
4. Enter the password for your Wi-Fi home network
5. Wait 1 minute until the LED is solid blue.



Info: Your Wi-Fi Home Cam will no longer be connected to your phone but will instead connect to your Wi-Fi home network.

Step 5: Connect your phone back to your Wi-Fi home network

1. Go to settings on your iPhone / Android phone
2. Click 'Wi-Fi'.
3. Select your Wi-Fi home network from the list of available networks.



Info: Your phone might connect to your Wi-Fi home network automatically. You can then skip these steps.

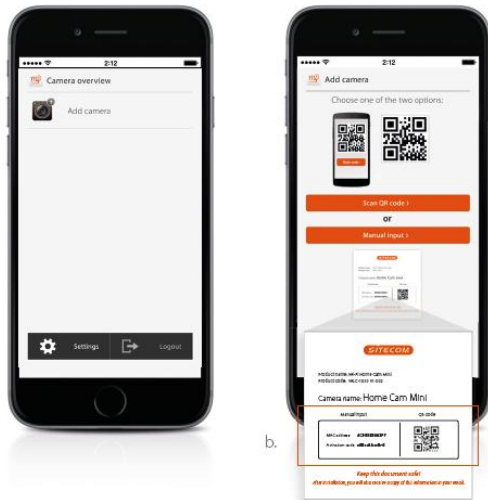
Step 6: Create a MyCam account or login with your Google account

1. Open the MyCam app
2. Create a new account or link with an existing Google account.
3. If you create a new account, you have to fill in the following:
 - a. Name: consisting of 4-32 alphanumeric characters
 - b. Password: choose a secure password and confirm by typing it again
 - c. Email address: This cannot be a Gmail address. If you want to use your Gmail address, please link your Google account.



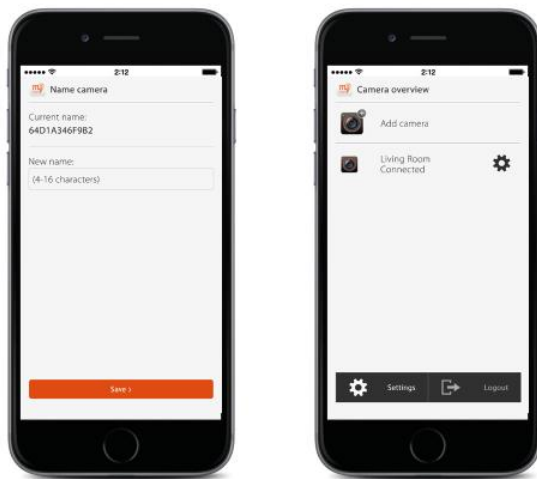
Step 7: Add your Wi-Fi Home Cam to your account

1. Press “Add camera” on the home screen
2. Pick an installation method. You can either scan the QR code on the back of the camera or add the camera by entering the information from the flyer.



Step 8: Name your Wi-Fi Home Cam

1. Pick a name for your camera (e.g. living room)
2. By clicking “save”, the installation process will be completed. Your camera will now appear on the home screen of the MyCam app.

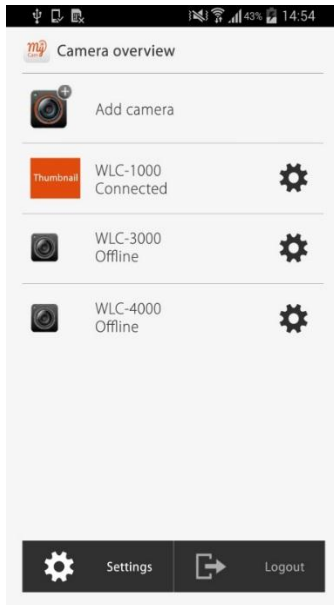

GET TO KNOW THE MYCAM APP

Camera overview

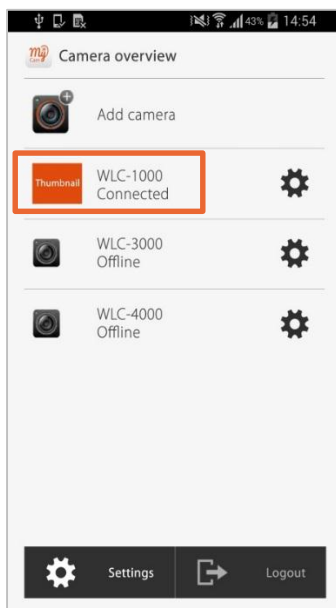
This screen is your home screen that you get to see after login. Here you can see all the Wi-Fi Home Cams that have been added to your account.



Live view

The live view of the camera lets you see the camera picture, control the camera and access the recordings of your camera.

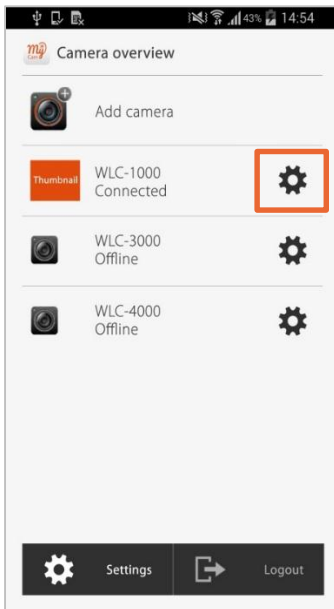
Click on the installed camera on the camera overview screen to go to the live view.



Camera settings

The camera settings screen lets you change things such as the quality of the recordings, activate the motion and sound detection and the date & time.

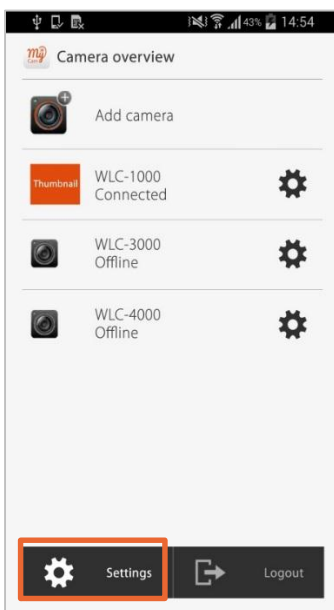
Click on the gear wheel symbol next to your installed camera to go to the camera settings.



MyCam account settings

The MyCam account settings screen lets you update the account settings, Google Drive settings, notifications settings and firmware updates.

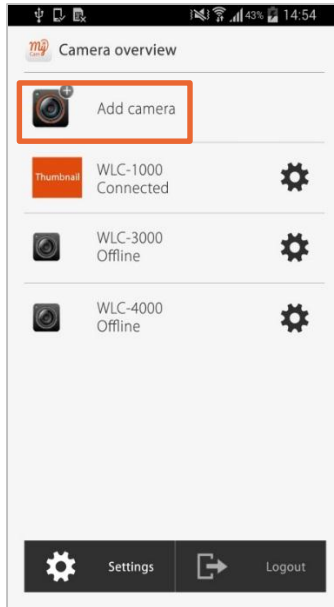
Click on the gear wheel symbol in the bottom left corner to go to the camera settings.



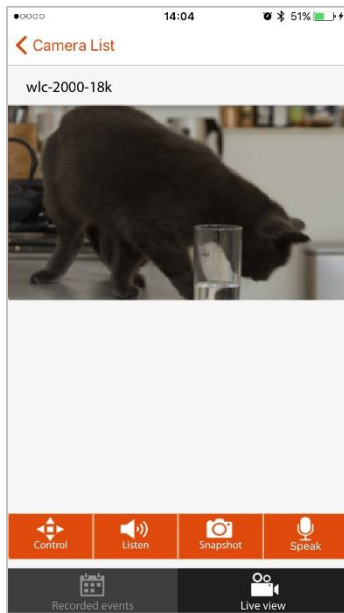
Add a new camera

The Add a new camera button allows you to add a new Wi-Fi Home Cam to your MyCam account to keep an eye on more room. You can add up to 99 cameras to your MyCam account, so there is practically no limit for you.

Click on the add camera button go to add a new camera. Follow the steps in the relevant chapter.



LIVE VIEW



Full screen view

If you tilt your phone sideways 90 degrees, the live view of the camera will go to full screen.

Back to home screen

- Press the “Camera list” button to go back to the camera overview screen

Control

- This button is only available if your camera has the ability to move (e.g. Wi-Fi Home Cam Twist).
- Press the button to see the control arrows for the camera.
- Press the arrows to move the camera left and right.
- Press the home icon will bring your camera back to its original position.

Listen

- Press the button to mute or unmute the microphone so that you can listen to the people or pets you are watching.

Snapshot

- Press the button to take a screenshot. The screenshot will be saved on your phone.

Speak

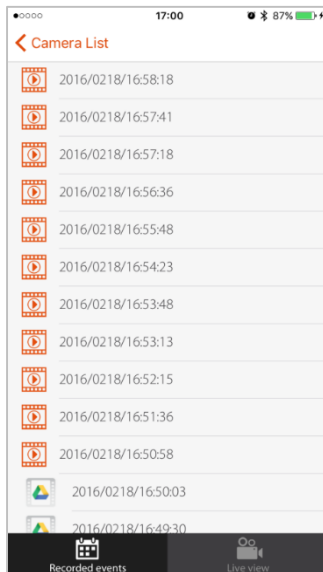
- Press the button to speak through the speaker of your Wi-Fi Home Cam, so that the people or pets you are watching, can hear you.

Recorded events

- Press the button to go to the videos that have been recorded with the camera. See the next chapter for an explanation of the screen.

RECORDED EVENTS

On the screen, you see an overview of all the motion and sound events that the camera recorded.

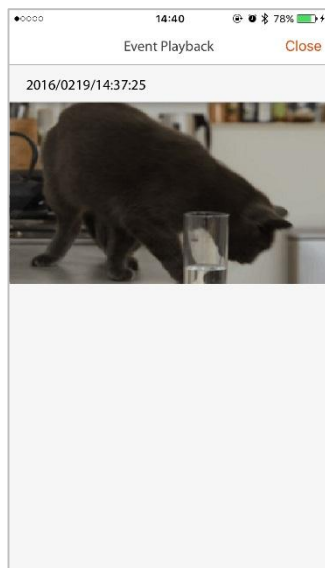


Filmstrip icon: Recorded on the microSD card and not saved in your Google Drive.

Google Drive icon: Recorded on the microSD card and backed up in your Google Drive.

Watch a recording

1. Click on any event to watch the recording. The video will play automatically.
2. While watching the video, you can press “Close” in the top right corner to go back to the recorded events screen.

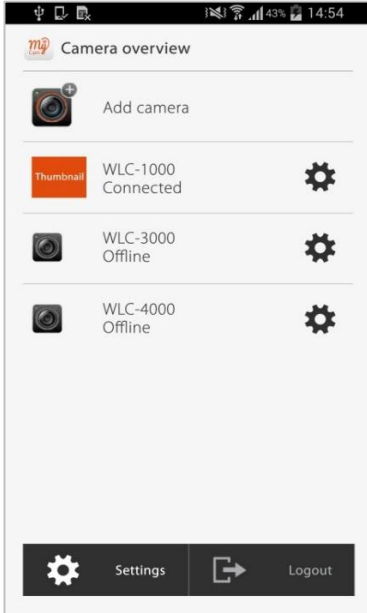


3. After the video has finished playing, you will go back to the recorded events screen automatically.

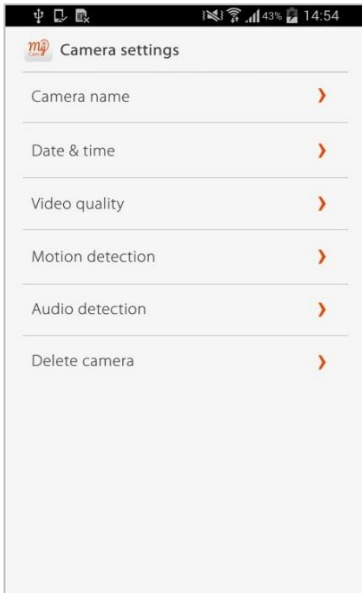
CAMERA SETTINGS

You can change the settings for every camera in your MyCam account individually.

1. Click the gear wheel icon next to your camera on the camera overview screen.




2. You will see the overview screen of the Wi-Fi Home Cam settings.



Change the camera name

On this screen, you can change the name you have given to your camera during the installation process.

1. Enter a new name into the field. The camera name can be between 4-16 characters. No spaces are allowed.

Change the date & time

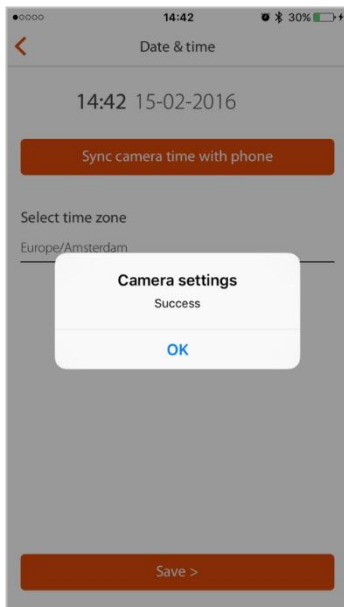
On this screen, you can change the date & time settings. You can either sync your camera with your phone or set the time zone manually.

Sync date & time automatically

1. Click “Sync camera time with phone” to update the camera time to the time of your phone.



2. After pressing the button, you will get to see a pop-up message telling you if the update succeeded or failed.



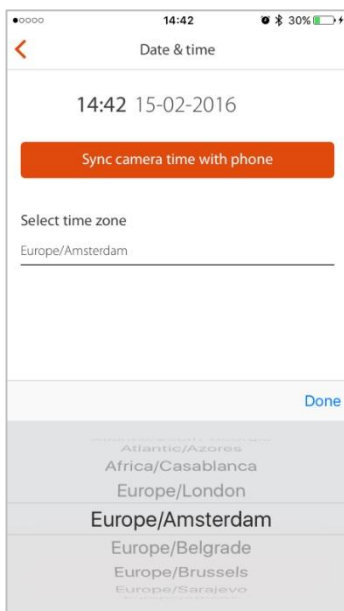
3. Click “Save” to save the changes and go back to the camera overview screen.

Set date & time manually

1. Click on the time zone that you currently see displayed on the screen.



2. You will see a pop-up screen with the time zones. Select the one you want to apply.
3. Click “Done” to exit the time zone menu.

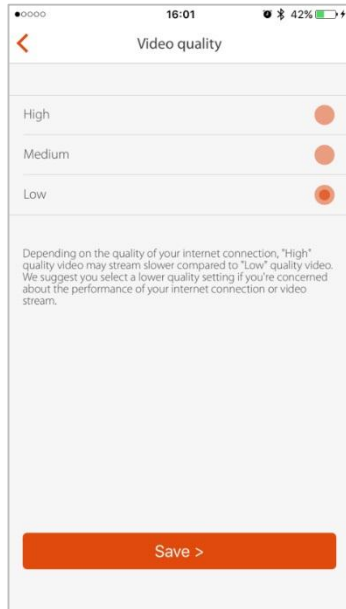


4. Click “Save” to save the changes and go back to the camera overview screen.

Change the video quality

On this screen, you can change the video quality. Depending on the speed and quality of your Internet and Wi-Fi connection, you might want to set the video quality lower to save bandwidth.

1. Select one of the video quality options by clicking on them.



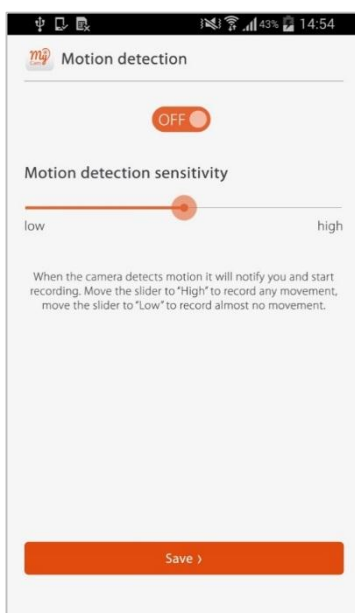
2. Click "Save" to save the changes and go back to the camera overview screen.

Activate & change the motion detection

On this screen, you can turn the motion detection on and off and adjust the sensitivity.

With motion detection activated, your camera will start recording automatically when it detects motion. The sensitivity of the motion detection determines when the camera will start recording and can be adjusted to best fit your home situation.

1. Move the on/off slider to turn motion detection on.
2. Adjust the slider to customize the sensitivity of the motion detection.
Moving the slider to “High” means it will record any movement, moving the slider to “Low” means it will record almost no movement. We suggest trying out different settings to see which one works best for you.



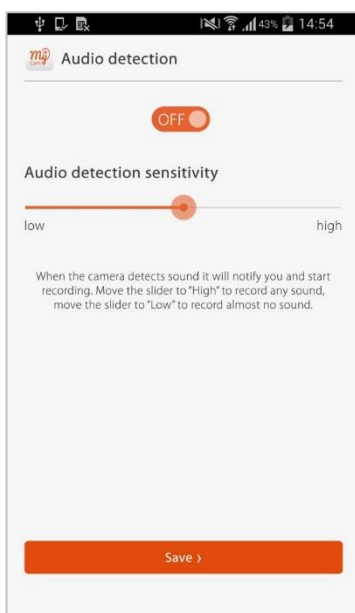
3. Click “Save” to save the changes and go back to the camera overview screen.

Activate & change the audio detection

On this screen, you can turn the audio detection on and off and adjust the sensitivity.

With audio detection activated, your camera will start recording automatically when it detects sound. The sensitivity of the audio detection determines when the camera will start recording and can be adjusted to best fit your home situation.

1. Move the on/off slider to turn audio detection on.
2. Adjust the slider to customize the sensitivity of the audio detection.
Moving the slider to “High” means it will record any sound, moving the slider to “Low” means it will record almost no sound. We suggest trying out different settings to see which one works best for you.



3. Click “Save” to save the changes and go back to the camera overview screen.

Delete the camera

On this screen, you can remove a camera from your MyCam account. You can then add that camera to a different MyCam account if you want to.

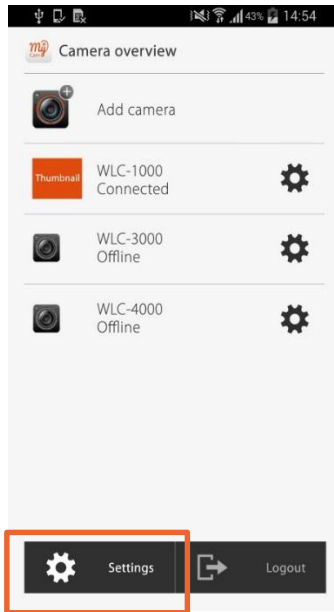
1. Click “Delete” to remove the camera from your MyCam account.



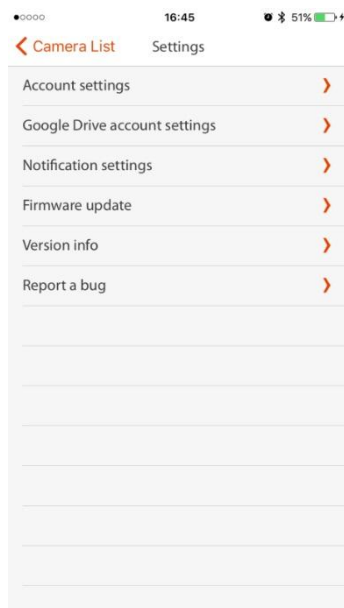
After you press the button, you will automatically go back to the camera overview screen once the camera has been removed.

MYCAM ACCOUNT SETTINGS

1. Press the button “Settings” in the bottom left corner




2. You will see the overview screen of the MyCam account settings.



Update the MyCam account settings

On this screen, you can update your MyCam account password.

1. Type a new password in the “New password” field
2. Confirm the password by typing it again in the “Confirm new password” field
3. Click “Save”.

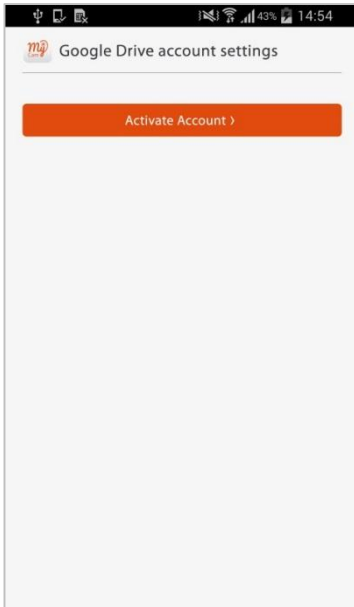

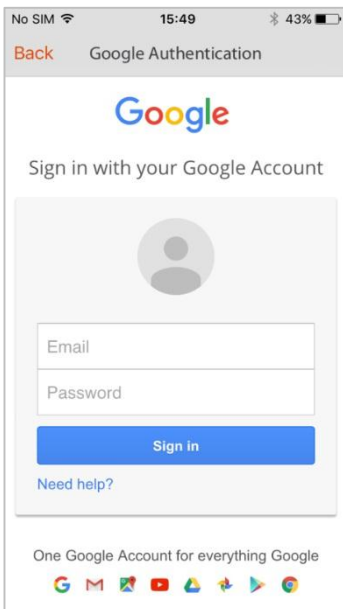
Add a Google Drive account or update it

On this screen, you can link a Gmail account to your MyCam account to back up your recordings into your personal Google Drive cloud or update the linked Gmail account. If you do not have an account yet and want to find out more about Google’s storage options, go to <https://www.google.com/drive>.

1. Click “Activate Account”



2. Sign in with your Google account and click “Allow” on the following screen.

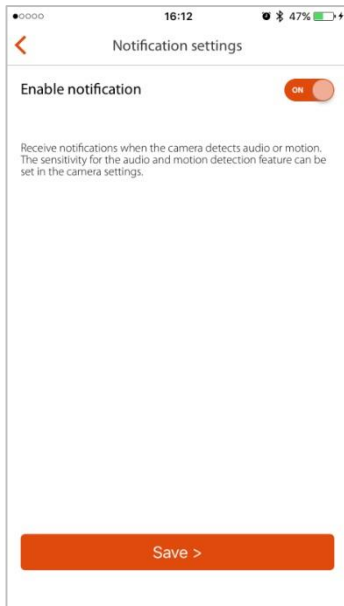


3. When your account was added successfully, you will see your E-Mail address and storage capacity in the “Google Drive account settings” screen.
4. Click “Change account” link a different Google Drive account to your MyCam account.

Update the notification settings

On this screen, you can turn push notifications for the Wi-Fi Home Cam on or off. You can receive a real-time notification any time a sound or motion event occurs.

1. Swipe the button to turn notifications on or off
2. Click “Save” to save the changes.

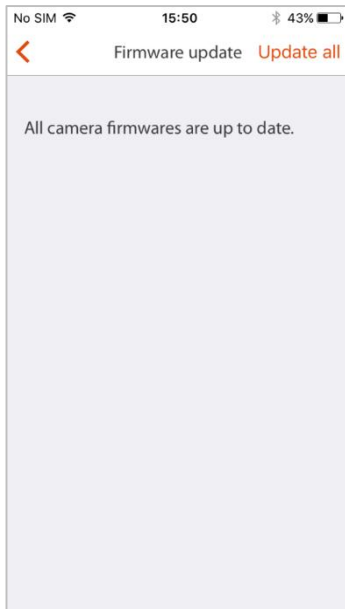


Update the firmware

On this screen, you can check if there is new firmware available for your Wi-Fi Home Cam.

1. Click “Firmware Update” to check if a new firmware is available. If a new firmware is available, it will be listed below.

If the firmware is up to date, you will see the following screen:



2. Click “Update all” to download and install the latest firmware.

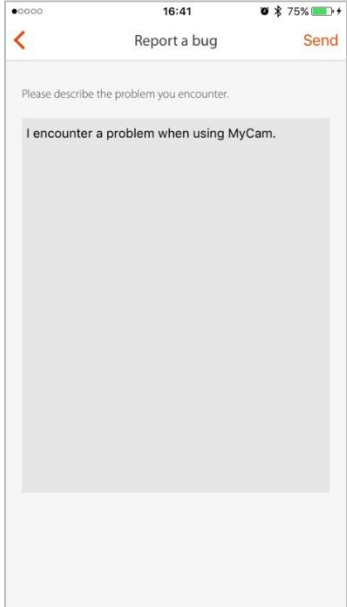
Check the version info of the MyCam app

On this screen, you can let us know about bugs or issues that you are experiencing with the MyCam app. Please describe the issue as detailed as possible and click “Save”.



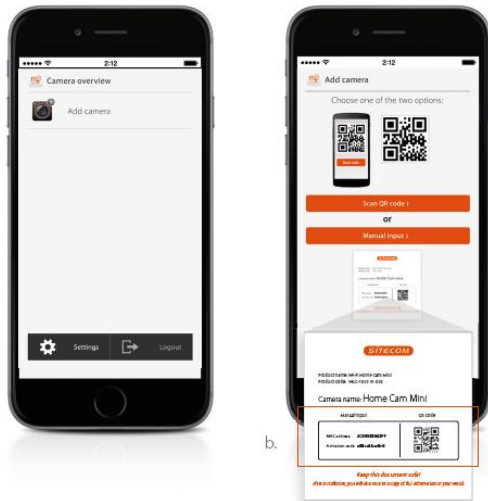

You can add as many cameras as you want to your MyCam account. Simply login to your MyCam app and follow the steps.

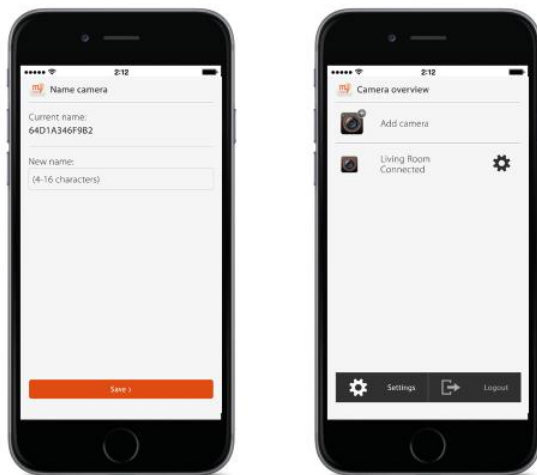


GET TO KNOW THE MYCAM PORTAL

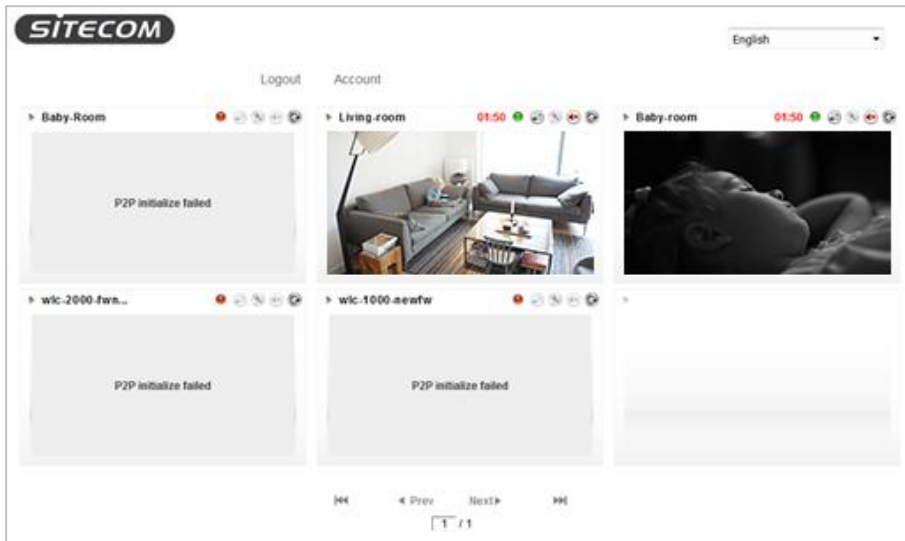

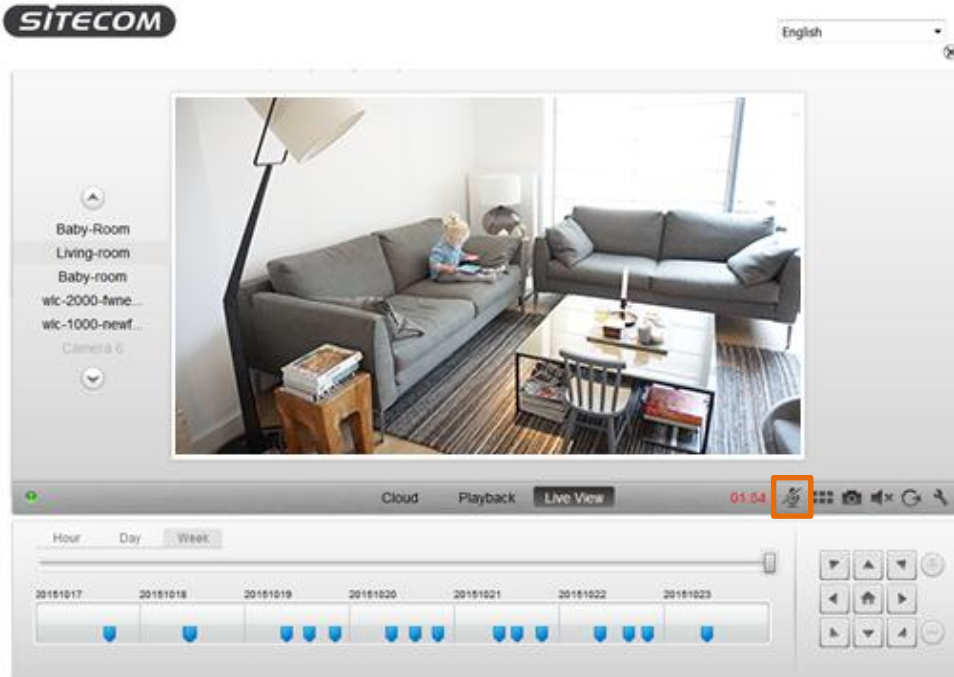

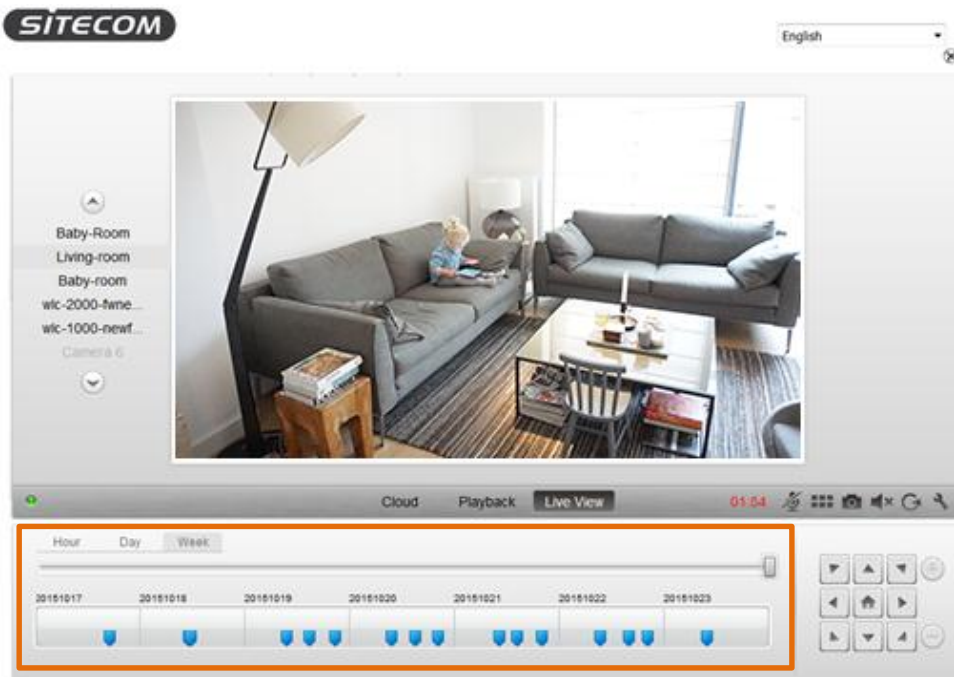

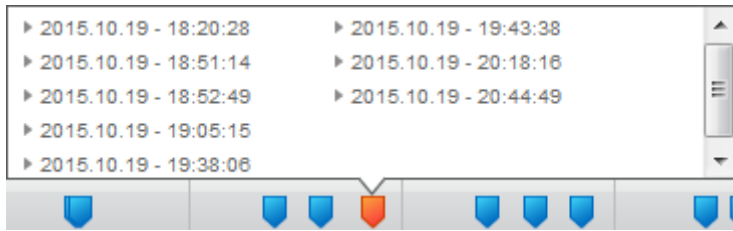

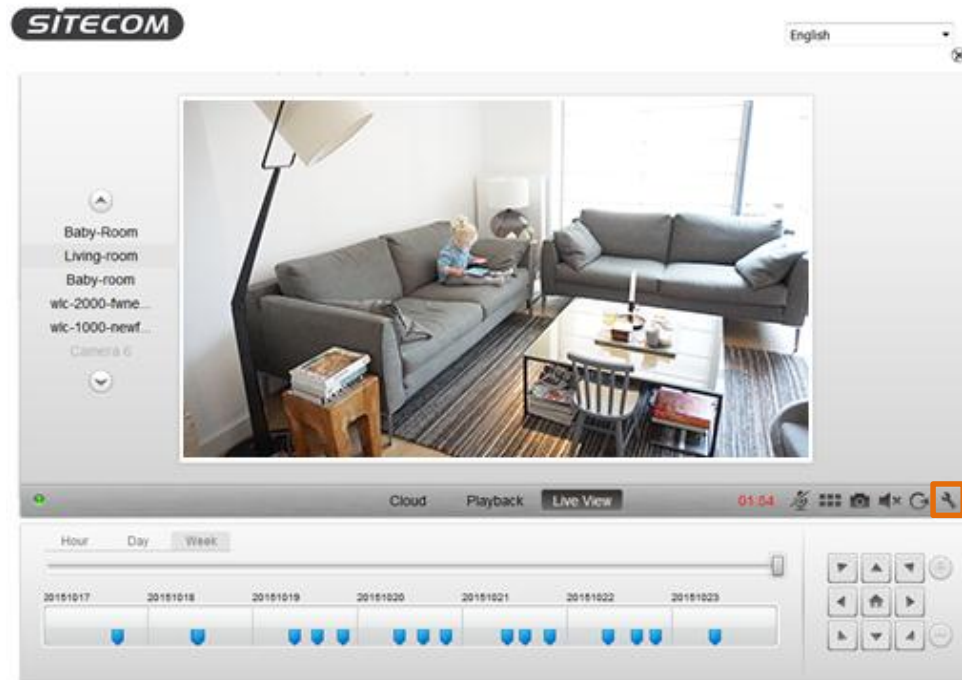

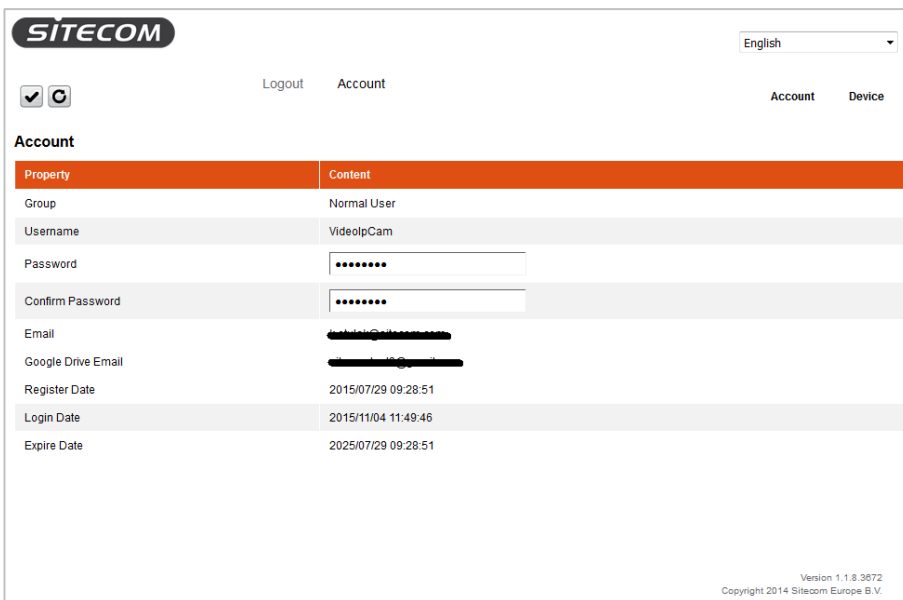

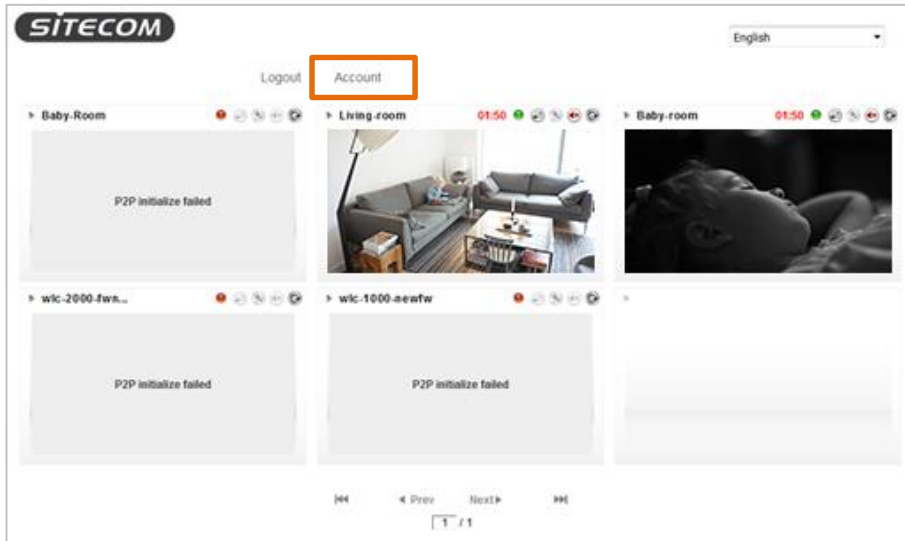

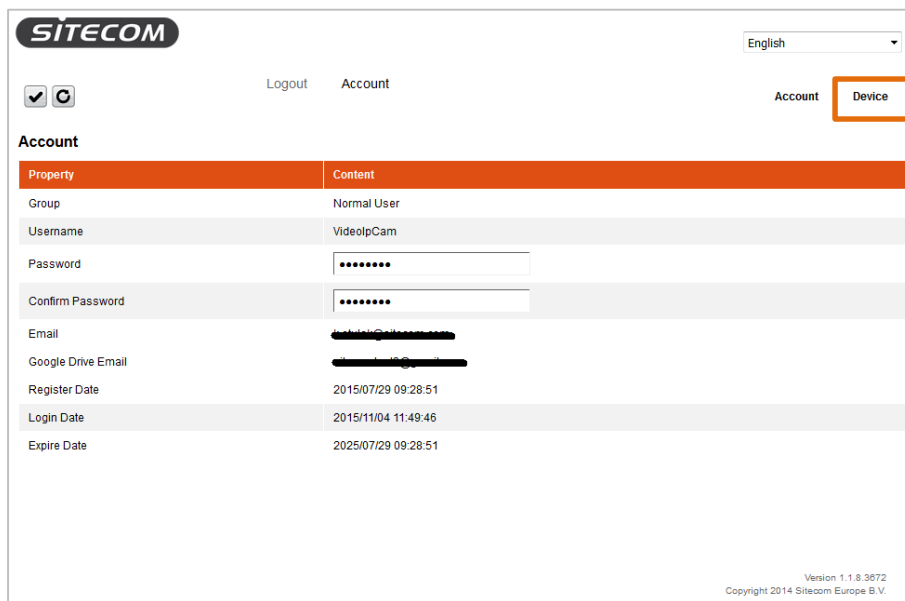

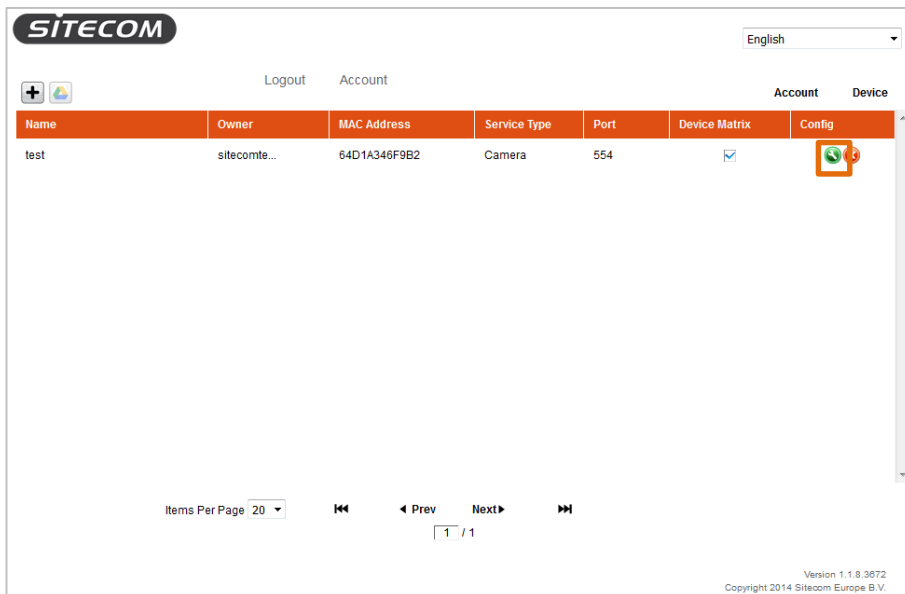

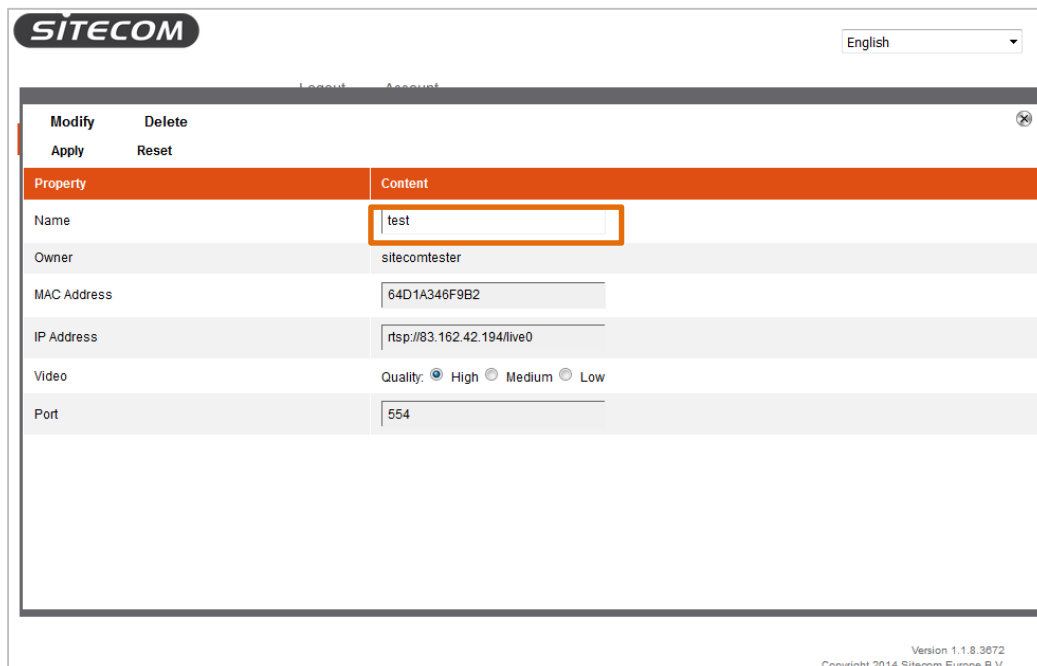



2. You will see the following message:

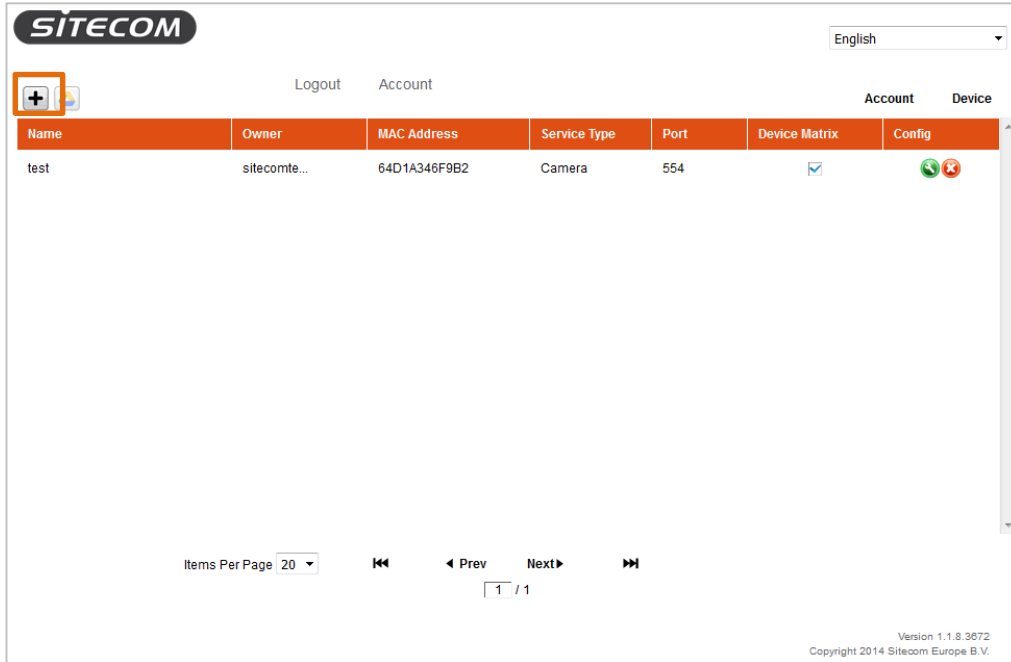


3. Click "OK" to confirm deleting the camera, click "Cancel" to stop the process.

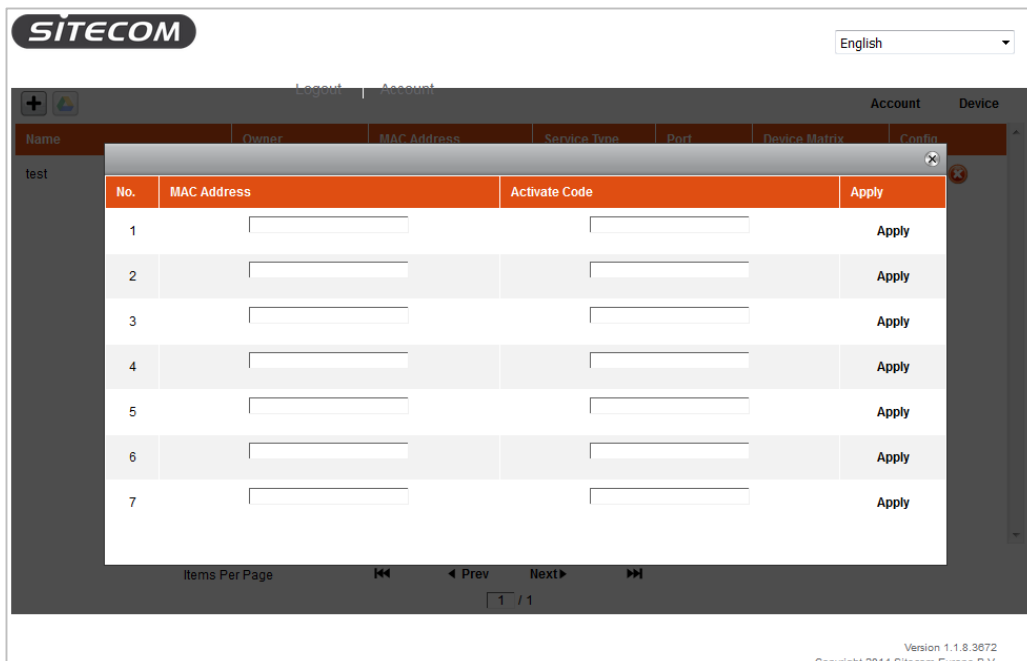
Add a camera

We strongly recommend to follow the steps in the printed Installation guide or in this manual, and install the camera with the MyCam app instead of going through the steps in the portal.

1. Click the plus symbol in the top left corner to add a new camera.



Follow the steps to add a new camera until you get the following screen:



2. Enter your MAC Address and the Activation Code. You can find them on the QR-code flyer included with your Wi-Fi Home Cam.
3. Click "Apply". If the installation was successful, the message "Success" will appear instead of "Apply".

If the installation was not successful, the message “No matching device” will appear.

Reboot the camera by removing the power cable. Connect the cable again to switch on the device, and make sure the camera is connected to your Wi-Fi home network. This is necessary to activate the camera.

Please follow the steps in the Installation guide or in this manual to connect your camera to your Wi-Fi home network.
