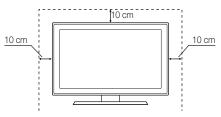

Constant displaying of still picture can cause ghosting of screen, which will affect image quality. To reduce risk of this effect, please follow below recommendations:

- Avoid displaying the same TV channel for long periods.
- Always try do display any image on full screen, use TV set picture format menu for best possible match.
- Reduce brightness and contrast values to minimum required to achieve desired picture quality, exceeded values may speed up the burnout process.
- Frequently use all TV features designed to reduce image retention and screen burnout, refer to proper user manual section for details.

#### Securing the Installation Space

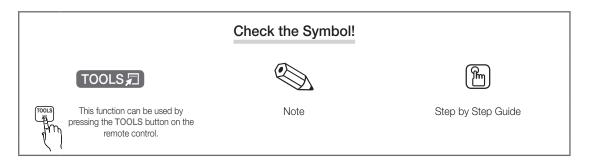
Keep the required distances between the product and other objects (e.g. walls) to ensure proper ventilation. Failing to do so may result in fire or a problem with the product due to an increase in the internal temperature. Install the product so the required distances shown in the figure are kept.

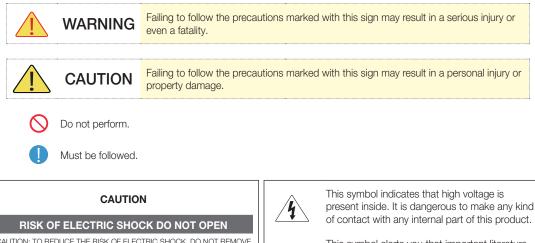

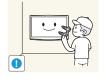
### Installation Related

### / Warning

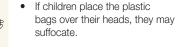

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### **Cleaning Related**

### 🔔 Warning



Before cleaning the product, unplug the power cord.

• Otherwise, it may result in electric shock or fire.



When cleaning the product, do not spray water directly over the product parts.

- Make sure that water does not enter the product.
- Otherwise, it may result in fire, electric shock or a problem with the product.



Avoid spraying cleansing agent directly onto the product.

 This may result in discoloration or cracking of the exterior of the product or the panel coming off.



When cleaning the product, disconnect the power cord and clean the product with the supplied cleaning cloth.

 Avoid using chemicals such as wax, benzene, alcohol, thinner, mosquito-repellent, fragrance, lubrication or cleansing agent when cleaning the product.

This may result in the exterior being deformed or the print being removed.



If you can't get the product clean with just the supplied cloth, use a soft, damp cloth with a "monitorexclusive cleansing agent" and wipe the product with it.

 If no monitor-exclusive cleansing agent is available, dilute a cleansing agent with water at a ratio of 1:10 before cleaning the product.



Since the exterior of the product is easily scratched, be sure to use the supplied cleansing cloth.

Do not place the adapter on top of another adapter.

Keep power adaptor away from any other heat source.

Remove the vinyl cover of the adapter before using the adaptor.

Always keep power adaptor in wellventilated area.



Be careful that adaptor should not be in contact with water and therefore not be wet.

Watching the product from too close a distance continuously may damage your eyesight.

#### Standby mode

Do not leave your TV in standby mode for long periods of time (when you are away on a holiday, for example). A small amount of electric power is still consumed even when the power button is turned off. It is best to unplug the power cord.

Viewing the Remote Control

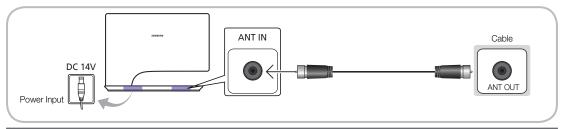
This is a special remote control for the visually impaired persons and has Braille points on the Power, Channel and Volume buttons.



#### **Connecting to an Antenna**

When the TV is initially powered on, basic settings proceed automatically.

🖄 Preset: Connecting the mains and antenna.



#### Plug & Play (Initial Setup)

When the TV is initially powered on, a sequence of on-screen prompts will assist in configuring basic settings. Press the POWER b button. Plug & Play is available only when the Input Source is set to TV.

#### If You Want to Reset This Feature...

Select System - Plug & Play (Initial Setup). Enter your 4 digit PIN number. The default PIN number is "0-0-0-0". If you want to change the PIN number, use the Change PIN function.

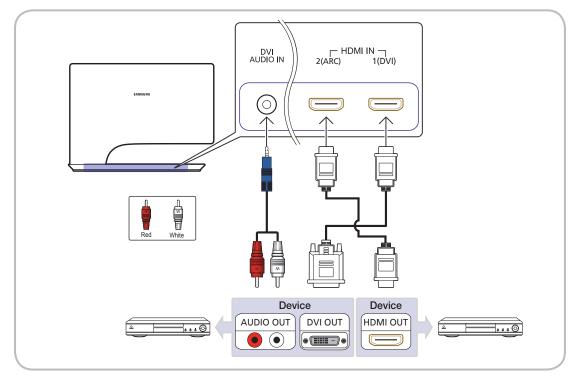
You should do Plug & Play (MENU  $\rightarrow$  System) again at home although you did in shop.

Solution If you forget the PIN code, press the remote control buttons in the following sequence in Standby mode, which resets the PIN to "0-0-0": POWER (off)  $\rightarrow$  MUTE  $\rightarrow$  8  $\rightarrow$  2  $\rightarrow$  4  $\rightarrow$  POWER (on).

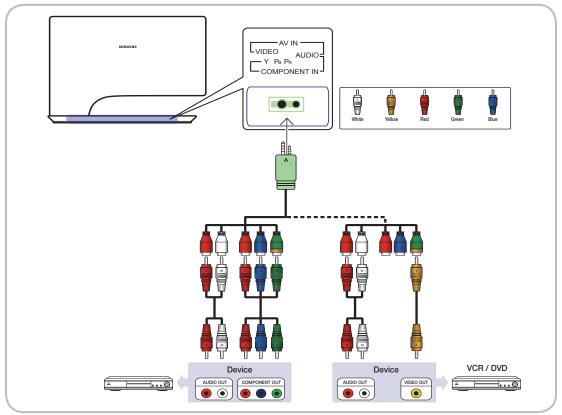


🖄 HDMI IN 1 (DVI), 2 (ARC) / DVI AUDIO IN

- Connecting the product to a digital device using an HDMI cable will improve the picture and sound quality.
- The HDMI cable does not require an additional audio cable as it supports digital video and audio signals.
- A digital device that is not compatible with HDMI output can be connected using an HDMI/DVI cable and an audio cable.
- The picture may not display normally (if at all) or the audio may not work if an external device that uses an older version of HDMI mode is connected to the TV. If such a problem occurs, ask the manufacturer of the external device about the HDMI version and, if out of date, request an upgrade.
- Be sure to use an HDMI cable with a thickness of 14 mm or less.
- Be sure to purchase a certified HDMI cable. Otherwise, the picture may not display or a connection error may occur.
- This TV supports the 3D and ARC (Audio Return Channel) functions. Note that the ARC function is only available when a cable is connected to the HDMI IN 2 (ARC) port.
- The ARC function can be used to output digital sound via the HDMI IN 2 (ARC) port and is only available when the TV is connected to an audio receiver that is compatible with the ARC function.
- Default Edit Name of HDMI IN 1 (DVI) terminal of this model is DVI PC for PC connection. When connecting to a AV device such as DVD or Blu-ray, it is required to change the Edit Name to the name of the connected device. (p. 20)

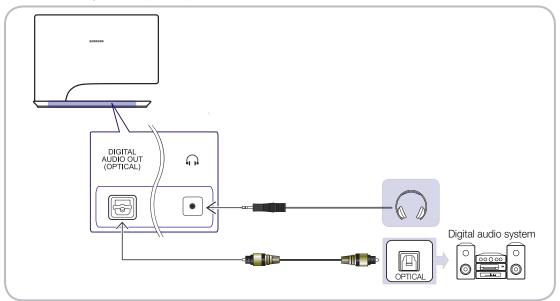

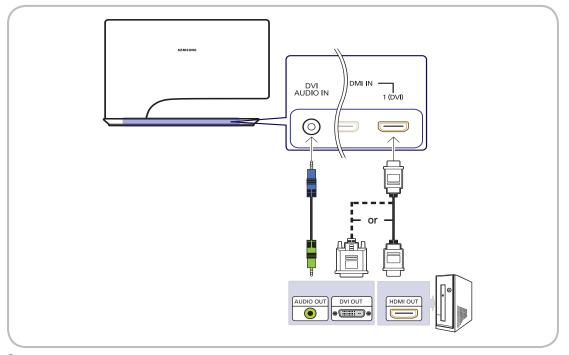
#### 🔊 DIGITAL AUDIO OUT (OPTICAL)

- When a Digital Audio System is connected to the DIGITAL AUDIO OUT (OPTICAL) jack, decrease the volume of both the TV and the system.
- 5.1 CH (channel) audio is available when the TV is connected to an external device supporting 5.1 CH.
- When the receiver (home theatre) is set to on, you can hear sound output from the TV's optical jack. When the TV is receiving a DTV signal, the TV will send 5.1 CH sound to the home theatre receiver. When the source is a digital component such as a DVD / Blu-ray player / cable box / STB (Set-Top-Box) satellite receiver and is connected to the TV via HDMI, only 2 CH audio will be heard from the home theatre receiver. If you want to hear 5.1 CH audio, connect the digital audio out jack from your DVD / Blu-ray player / cable box / STB satellite receiver directly to an amplifier or home theatre.
- Leadphones : You can connect your headphones to the headphones output on your set. While the headphones are connected, the sound from the built-in speakers will be disabled.
  - Sound function may be restricted when connecting headphones to the TV.
  - Headphone volume and TV volume are adjusted separately.

#### Connecting to a PC

#### Connection using an HDMI or HDMI/DVI cable

If a non-standard video format is selected, the TV may not operate normally.

#### Compatible PC resolutions (when the PC is connected to the HDMI IN 1 (DVI) port)

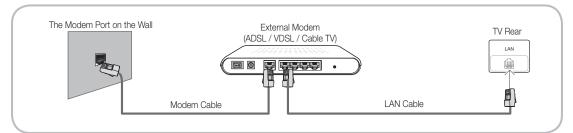

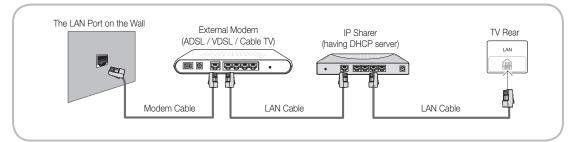
#### Connecting to a Wired Network

You can attach your TV to your LAN using cable in three ways:

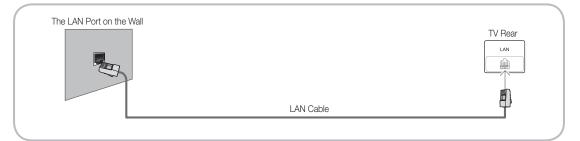
• You can attach your TV to your LAN by connecting the LAN port on the back of your TV to an external modern using a LAN cable. See the diagram below.



• You can attach your TV to your LAN by connecting the LAN port on the back of your TV to a IP Sharer which is connected to an external modem. Use LAN cable for the connection. See the diagram below.



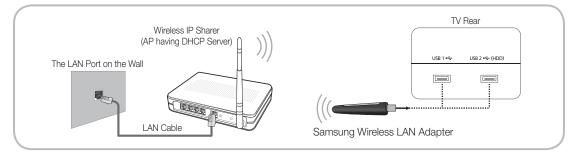

port on the back of your TV directly to a network wall outlet using a LAN cable. See the diagram below. Note that the wall
outlet is attached to a modem or router elsewhere in your house.



- If you have a Dynamic Network, you should use an ADSL modem or router that supports Dynamic Host Configuration Protocol (DHCP). Modems and routers that support DHCP automatically provide the IP address, subnet mask, gateway, and DNS values your TV needs to access the Internet so you do not have to enter them manually. Most home networks are Dynamic Networks. Some networks require a Static IP address. If your network requires a Static IP address, you must enter the IP address, subnet mask, gateway, and DNS values manually on your TV's Cable Setup Screen when you set up the network connection. To get the IP address, subnet mask, gateway, and DNS values, contact your Internet Service Provider (ISP). If you have a Windows computer, you can also get these values through your computer.
- You can use ADSL modems that support DHCP if your network requires a Static IP address. ADSL modems that support DHCP also let you use Static IP addresses.
- $^{\scriptsize ext{M}}$  It is not supported when the network speed is under 10 Mbps.

#### Connecting to a Wireless Network

To connect your TV to your network wireless, you need a wireless router or modem and a Samsung Wireless LAN adapter (WIS09ABGN, WIS09ABGN2, WIS10ABGN-sold separately), which you connect to your TV's back or side panel USB port. See the illustration below.



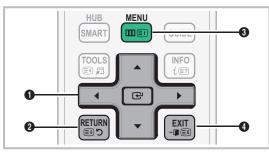
Samsung's Wireless LAN adapter is sold separately and is offered by selected retailers, Ecommerce sites and Samsungparts. com. Samsung's Wireless LAN adapter supports the IEEE 802.11a/b/g and n communication protocols. Samsung recommends using IEEE 802.11n. When you play video over a IEEE 802.11b/g connection, the video may not play smoothly.

#### 🔍 NOTE

- You must use the "Samsung Wireless LAN adapter" (WIS09ABGN, WIS09ABGN2, WIS10ABGN) to use a wireless network.
- Samsung Wireless LAN adapter and The USB extension Cable are sold separately and are offered by select retailers, Ecommerce sites and Samsungparts.com.
- To use a wireless network, your TV must be connected to a wireless IP sharer (either a router or a modem). If the wireless IP sharer supports DHCP, your TV can use a DHCP or static IP address to connect to the wireless network.
- Select a channel for the wireless IP sharer that is not currently being used. If the channel set for the wireless IP sharer is currently being used by another device nearby, this will result in interference and communication failure.
- If you apply a security system other than the systems listed below, it will not work with the TV.
  - If Pure High-throughput (Greenfield) 802.11n mode is selected and the Encryption type is set to WEP, TKIP or TKIP AES (WPS2Mixed) for your wireless router, Samsung TVs will not support a connection in compliance with new Wi-Fi certification specifications.
- If your wireless router supports WPS (Wi-Fi Protected Setup), you can connect to the network via PBC (Push Button Configuration) or PIN (Personal Identification Number). WPS will automatically configure the SSID and WPA key in either mode.
- If your router, modem, or device is not certified, it may not connect to the TV via the "Samsung Wireless LAN adapter."
- Connection Methods: You can setup the wireless network connection on five ways.
  - Auto Setup (Using the Auto Network Search function)
  - Manual Setup
  - WPS (PBC)
  - One Foot Connection
  - Plug & Access
- The TV may not recognize the Samsung Wireless LAN adapter if you connect it to the TV with a USB hub or USB extension cable other than the cable supplied with the TV.

To resolve this problem, ask your ISP about the procedures required to connect devices other than a PC (such as your TV) to the Internet.

If your Internet service provider requires an ID or password to connect to the Internet, your TV may not be able to connect to the Internet. If this is the case, you must enter your ID or password when connecting to the Internet. The internet connection may fail because of a firewall

problem. If this is the case, contact your Internet service provider.

If you cannot connect to the Internet even after you have followed the procedures suggested by your Internet service provider, please contact a Samsung Electronics dealer or customer service centre.

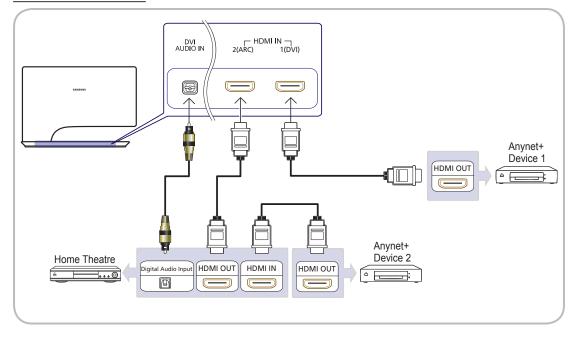
#### Anynet+

#### What is Anynet+? TOOLS

Anynet+ is a function that enables you to control all connected Samsung devices that support Anynet+ with your Samsung TV's remote. The Anynet+ system can be used only with Samsung devices that have the Anynet+ feature. To be sure your Samsung device has this feature, check if there is an Anynet+ logo on it.

- You can only control Anynet+ devices using the TV remote control, not the buttons on the TV.
- The TV remote control may not work under certain conditions. If this occurs, reselect the Anynet+ device.
- The Anynet+ functions do not operate with other manufacturers' products.
- For the method of connecting external devices, refer to the supported user manual.

#### To connect to Home Theatre



- 1. Connect the HDMI IN (1(DVI), 2(ARC)) jack on the TV and the HDMI OUT jack of the corresponding Anynet+ device using an HDMI cable.
- 2. Connect the HDMI IN jack of the home theatre and the HDMI OUT jack of the corresponding Anynet+ device using an HDMI cable.

### $\textcircled{MENU} \blacksquare \rightarrow System \rightarrow Anynet+ (HDMI-CEC) \rightarrow ENTER \textcircled{P}$

#### Anynet+ (HDMI-CEC) (Off / On)

To use the Anynet+ Function, Anynet+ (HDMI-CEC) must be set to On.
When the Anynet+ (HDMI-CEC) function is disabled, all the Anynet+ related operations are deactivated.

- Auto Turn Off (No / Yes): Setting an Anynet+ Device to turn off automatically when the TV is turned off.
  - If Auto Turn Off is set to Yes, running external devices will turn off at the same time as the TV powers off. However, a device may not turn off if recording is in progress.
  - May not be enabled depending on the device.

### Switching between Anynet+ Devices

- Press the TOOLS button to select Anynet+ (HDMI-CEC). And then press the ENTER I button to select Device List.
   If you cannot find a device you want, select Refresh to refresh the list.
- 2. Select a device and press the ENTER I button. You can switch to the selected device.

🖄 The Device List menu will only appear when you set Anynet+ (HDMI-CEC) to On in the System menu.

- Switching to the selected device may take up to 2 minutes. You cannot cancel the operation during the switching operation.
- If you have selected external input mode by pressing the SOURCE button, you cannot use the Anynet+ function. Make sure to switch to an Anynet+ device by using the Device List.

### Listening through a Receiver

- You can listen to sound through a receiver (i.e Home Theatre) instead of the TV Speaker.
- 1. Select Receiver and set to On.
- 2. Press the EXIT button to exit.
  - $^{\scriptsize \ensuremath{\boxtimes}}$  If your receiver supports audio only, it may not appear in the device list.
  - The receiver will work when you have properly connected the optical in jack of the receiver to the DIGITAL AUDIO OUT (OPTICAL) jack of the TV.
  - When the receiver (i.e Home Theatre) is set to On, you can hear sound output from the TV's Optical jack. When the TV is displaying a DTV (aerial) signal, the TV will send out 5.1 channel sound to the receiver. When the source is a digital component such as a DVD and is connected to the TV via HDMI, only 2 channel sound will be heard from the receiver.

#### Using the ARC function

You can listen to sound through a receiver connected using an HDMI cable without the need for a separate optical cable.

- 1. Select Receiver and set to On.
- 2. Press the EXIT button to exit.
- To use the ARC function, a receiver which supports the HDMI-CEC and ARC features must be connected to the HDMI IN 2 (ARC) port.
- To disable the ARC function, set the **Receiver** to **Off**. Even if the TV transmits the ARC signal continuously, the receiver will be blocked from receiving the signal.

### Analogue Channel Teletext Feature

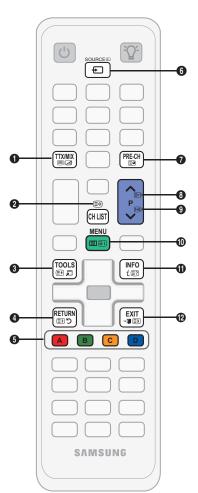
The index page of the Teletext service gives you information on how to use the service. For Teletext information to be displayed correctly, channel reception must be stable. Otherwise, information may be missing or some pages may not be displayed.

 $^{igodold N}$  You can change Teletext pages by pressing the numeric buttons on the remote control.

- (Teletext on/mix/off): Activates the Teletext mode for the current channel. Press the button twice to overlap the Teletext mode with the current broadcasting screen. Press it one more time to exit teletext.
- (store): Stores the Teletext pages.
- (size): Displays the teletext on the upper half of the screen in double-size. To move the text to the lower half of the screen, press it again. For normal display, press it once again.
- (hold): Holds the display at the current page, in the case that there are several secondary pages that follow automaticially. To undo, press it again.
- Colour buttons (red, green, yellow, blue): If the FASTEXT system is used by the broadcasting company, the different topics on a Teletext page are colour-coded and can be selected by pressing the coloured buttons. Press the colour corresponding to the topic of your choice. A new colourcoded page is displayed. Items can be selected in the same way. To display the previous or next page, press the corresponding coloured button.
- 6 (mode): Selects the Teletext mode (LIST/ FLOF).

If pressed during LIST mode, switches the mode to List save mode. In List save mode, you can save a Teletext page into a list using the (Erg)(store) button.

(sub-page): Displays the available sub-page.



- (page up): Displays the next Teletext page.
- (page down): Displays the previous Teletext page.
- (index): Displays the index (contents) page at any time while you are viewing Teletext.
- (reveal): Displays the hidden text (answers to quiz games, for example). To display the normal screen, press it again.
- (cancel): Shrinks the Teletext display to overlap with the current broadcast.

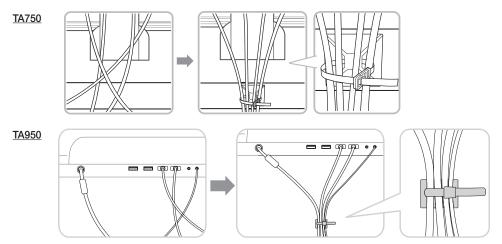

#### Anti-theft Kensington Lock

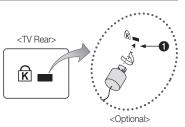
The Kensington Lock is not supplied by Samsung. It is a device used to physically fix the system when using it in a public place. The appearance and locking method may differ from the illustration depending on the manufacturer. Refer to the manual provided with the Kensington Lock for additional information on proper use.

Nease find a "R" icon on the rear of the TV. A kensington slot is beside the R" icon.

#### To lock the product, follow these steps:

- 1. Wrap the Kensington lock cable around a large, stationary object such as desk or chair.
- 2. Slide the end of the cable with the lock attached through the looped end of the Kensington lock cable.
- 3. Insert the locking device into the Kensington slot on the product (1).
- 4. Lock the lock.

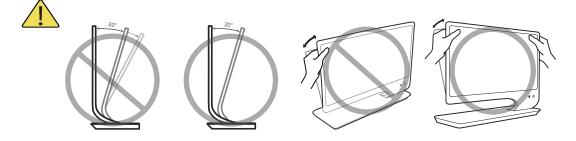
